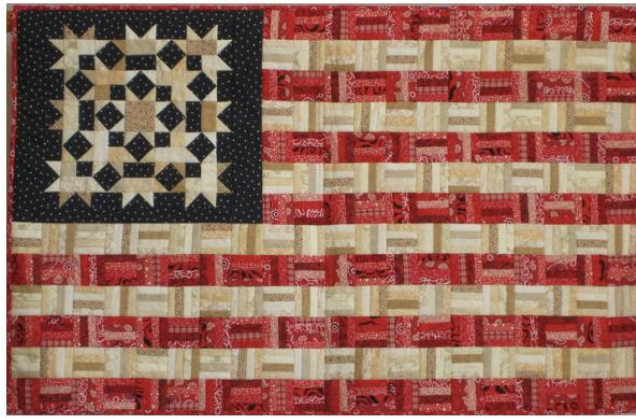
My U.F.O. count so far: 10 done, 4 tops done, and 17 projects for others. Still slow going.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE

Dear fellow quilters,

For this month's newsletter, Gabriele Leko wrote the following about our donation to a Gold Star mom:

### Angels on Quilters' Shoulders

Yes, our stashes exist in various degrees of unbelievable; we cut up perfectly good fabric only to sew it back together again; we use up a lot of time making and learning. (Are our angels snickering yet?) That's not all. We participate in community service because, really, how many quilts can one bed have? But that's not the point.

The reasons to quilt are as varied as our personalities. Above all, one thing stands out with most quilters, and that is the need to give.

Among our many service projects is the American Gold Star Mothers, Inc., an organization of mothers who have lost a child in service to the USA. It was established in 1928 and chartered by the US Congress in 1984; the members honor their children through service to veterans and at patriotic events.

Kathy Colley is a local Gold Star Mom who visited the SCV Quilt Guild board meeting in April. Her heavy schedule as a member of SCV Water Board conflicted with our Guild's general meetings, so she stopped by to say thanks for the quilt we gave her—and more.

Her son joined the army after high school graduation, a sweet boy, Kathy said, who found his special niche working with helicopters. He took with him his Oma's quilt that she had made for his graduation. In time, he was sent to the Middle East. The Colley family history is military, and all returned home except her sweet boy.

This May will be 10 years since his death in 2007. In the packing up of his belongings by the army, Oma's quilt went missing and was never found. Kathy was devastated. Then our Guild did what we love to do, presented her with a quilt. She was overwhelmed. She said, "This is the first time that someone did this for our son. It meant that our son's life and service mattered."

"This is something special you did. We can cuddle up with it. It is right there displayed on the living room sofa."

When Kathy opened up the wrapping on our quilt, she was also stunned. The pattern, a rail fence, was nearly like Oma's.

"You all had angels on your shoulders. You really touched us."

Quilters, keep on cutting up perfectly good fabric only to sew it back together again. Make those ump-teen patterns. Have a cup of tea as you piece. Or maybe a glass of wine. And honor our heroes with your art and your craft. We speak volumes with needle

and thread, just like Betsy Ross, the Civil War quilters, and many unknown others from around the world who created quilts for warmth, necessity, or beauty.

It's nice to know when someone is touched by our work. (Our angels are smiling and winking.)

We are beginning to look at ideas for our 2018 Opportunity Quilt! Get your ideas together and bring them to the meeting in April!

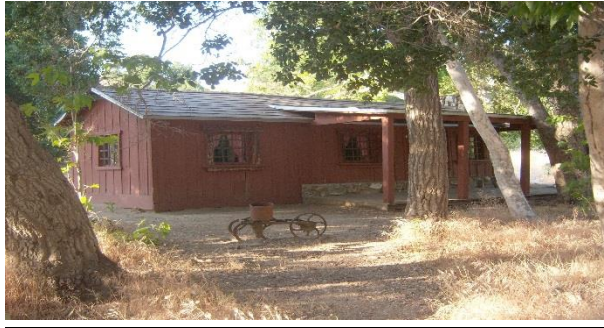

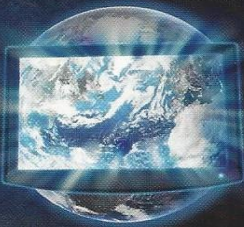
