
BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Prosy for Spring Sept, Oct, Nov.

12.5" Block 12" finished block

Cut four 6.5" squares of any calor or floral print for the flower petals

Cut eight 2.25" squares of white or off white for the background.

Cut one 3" Circle of Yellow fabric with fusible web for the panay center

- A Sew one 2.25" square of background fabric to the two top corners of each block. Trim off the extra fabric from the briangle.
- 8. Sew the four blocks together two at a time, making sure you rotate the blocks as in the picture.
- C. Iron on the flower center and stitch down as you like.


