June 6th. We will be there from 8am to set up to 4pm. Please let me know if you can help out.



Quilt History

Quilt scandal, 1933 From About Home.com

Margaret Rogers Caden, of Lexington, Kentucky, submitted her prize-winning 'Unknown Star' quilt for a quilting contest sponsored by Sears at the 1933 World's Fair in Chicago, Illinois. The fair is better known as A Century of Progress International Exposition, and was held to celebrate Chicago's centennial by showcasing advances that had taken place in science and technology over the previous 100 years.

The photo below was snapped when the Unknown Star quilt was presented to Eleanor Roosevelt.

Mrs. Rogers Caden and her quilt caused a bit of a scandal later, when it was revealed that she had paid a team of women to construct the project, from the patchwork to its perfect 16 stitches per inch quilting. Entrants were required to sign a statement verifying they were the sole quiltmakers

Rogers Caden was awarded \$1,000 from Sears, the sponsor of the contest, plus \$250 in other prizes, and she never admitted publicly that the quilt was not her own work.

The quilt was sewn from Sears 'Fast Color Cottons' in two shades of solid green, along with a green and yellow print. The border fabric matched the darker green stars.


