COMMUNITY SERVICE

Thanks again to those who took the 3 quilts that needed binding. As always, look for us in the back for items we need help on to complete.

As for March, which is Community Service Sew Night, we are calling it "Chat and Scat with a project to take home". How about that? We have listened to those who said their machine is too heavy to bring. This way, you can visit with your quilty friends (chat) and then leave (scat) with a project you pick up from the back to work on at home (and please bring back to the next meeting) We have quilts/placemats that need binding put on, we have placemats that need to be made, and we really need 2 1/2" cut binding made up (for placemats, we need 2 strips sewn together/for small turtle camp quilts, we need at least 5 to 6 strips cut and sewn together). If you wish to bring your machine, there will be quilts/placemats that need binding sewn on and turtles that need to be sewed up.

We thank you for your support of Community Service.

A quick run-down of sizes of projects that we are currently working on include:

BINDING:

2 1/2" strips need to be made

TURTLE CAMP QUILTS:

35-40 inches wide by 45-50 inches long (Small quilts that are taken home)
60 inches by 80 inches (quilts for the beds)

SENIOR CENTER:

24 inches (approx.) by 70 inches (approx.) for Shawls

15 inches by 18 inches for placemats

VETERANS:

64 inches by 75 inches

COMMUNITY SERVICE (cont.)

These measurements are ballpark, meaning, they can be slightly smaller or bigger, by not by much! You can either make the tops or make an entire quilt. It's up to you.

New, nearly new items only, something you would like to receive. Fabric should be cut to a usable size. 5" squares, 2.5" strips,

fat 8^{th} , $\frac{1}{4}$ yard, fat quarter, half yard etc. Ironed and folded neatly please no edges from previous projects. It is OK to use

your stash, but try to give something that will coordinate with each other or give to Ways and Means to use at another time.

Ways and Means (cont)

The fabric can have a theme, flowers, food, transportation, Americana, 30's, fall, Holidays, animals, gardening etc.

You can also just choose a color, black/white, red/white, golds/browns or all plaids, checks or dots...the combinations are endless. Books, patterns, tools, hot pads, pin cushions or other new handmade items are welcome. Books and patterns should be new or gently used. Please no copyrighted copies of patterns, books or magazines.

Ways and Means would be happy to assemble your basket if you feel you can't or don't want to. Or you can just donate items for us to put in the baskets we make up. Give us a call and we will pick up your items or you can bring them to the meeting.

You won't want to miss a meeting as we will have some wonderful baskets for the raffle and even quilts and wall hangings to add to the fun.
