#### **PROGRAMS**


Hello, Quilters and UFO busters!

We have been asked by many members about dimensions for various projects. Here are a few:


Turtle Camp - Bed quilts 60 inches by 80 inches

Shawls - 22-24 inches by 60 inches

Placemats - 14inches x 19 inches



Cutting- white on white 1 5 1/2" square cut on the diagonals


4 4 1/2" squares

1 4 1/2" square
