# International Quilt Festival

International Quilt Festival/Long Beach, CA will be August 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>, 2013 with preview on the 1<sup>st</sup>, at the Long Beach Convention Center

Please announce at your meetings and/or put in your newsletter our show dates and that we are looking for workers to help hang the special exhibit quilts before Festival, guardians to watch over the quilts during Festival, doorpersons to take tickets, and workers to help with takedown of special exhibit guilts after the show is closed. These are paid positions (\$8 an hour). We also pay for parking (up to \$10) and you receive free entry for each day you work (a \$10 value). If your guild does not have an opportunity quilt, members can work to earn money for the guild and still receive free entry and parking. The money will be combined and one check will be written to the guild.

SC Council April meeting was a special "Meet the Teachers" event. These council meetings begin with the requisite reports and parliamentary voting. New and old business and board positions can be voted on as well. The business meeting is then adjourned and the program begins.

Meet the Teachers was well-planned and provided guild reps and interested members of each guild with a unique opportunity. They could actually meet and interact with prospective traditional and modern quilt teachers. Each teacher was given 3 minutes to present their "teaching product". Most teachers also had a table set up to display their various classes and sign contracts if offered by a guild.

It is so much easier to be able to hear and meet with teachers in the local and distant areas in one location. Sometimes we are not aware of teachers that are virtually in our back yard. This can also make learning new experiences fun while keeping the costs of the meeting speakers/workshops to a much more affordable level.

Participating in an event such as the Meet the Teachers also points to the importance of getting information from surveys and member input prior to attending. Our Program Chairs and guild leaders want to hear from you on speakers and those you'd like to see in a workshop as well as other ideas. So let them hear from you often; it need not be just an annual thing.

# Boston Star

Technique-Pieced

Block Size-12 1/2 x 12 1/2'

Fabrics- white on white, red, and blue

Cutting- white on white 1 5 1/2" square cut on the diagonals


4 4 1/2" squares

Red 1 5 ¼" square cut on the diagonals

1 4 1/2" square

Blue 2 4 7/8" squares cut on the diagonal [3]

Total pieces-17
