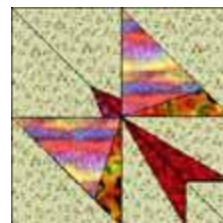

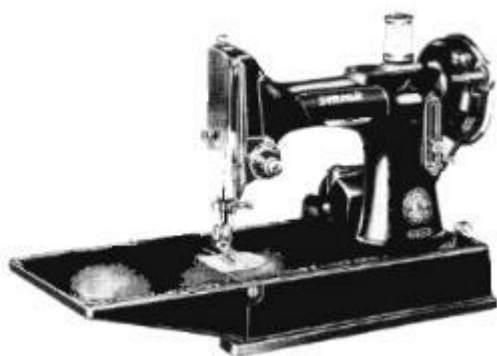



SCVQG Block of the Month

Feb. 2012

Four by Three

Technique- Pieced

Block Size- 12 ½" x 12 ½"

Fabrics- blue print and white on white

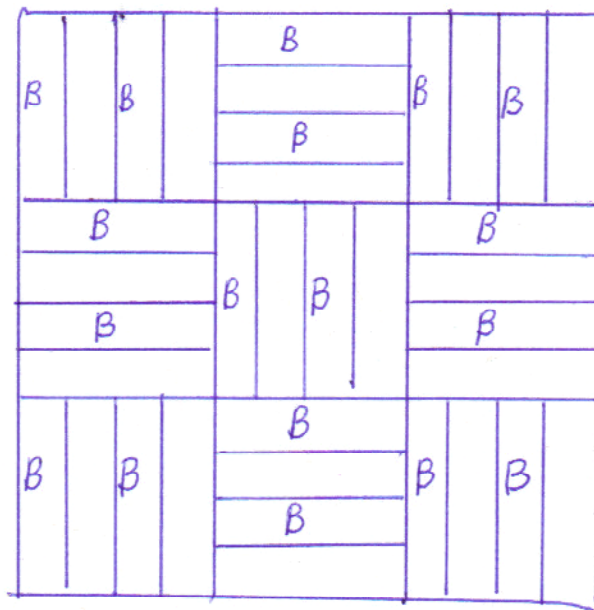
Cutting-white 18 1 ½" x 4 ½"

Blue 18 1 ½" x 4 ½"

Simplified- cut 2 1 ½" x 40 " strips of each color. Sew together.

Then cut into 4 ½" pieces and sew the 9 pieces into the 9 patch.

Number of pieces-36
