March 8, 2012

To the Santa Clarita Valley Quilt Guild,

Here's what happened to one of your quilts:

I'm a volunteer from Wisconsin who was in Tuscaloosa, AL., last week staying at Camp Coker, working with the local Hopebuilders.

I was sleeping on an air mattress on a concrete floor in the unheated part of Camp Coker building. The first night I was cold; the next day I saw the box with the quilts and picked out a sunny yellow one. When I left last Saturday I returned it to the box. There were also quilts upstairs in the dorm part which I saw later.

<u>Thanks</u> for your work & generosity. It made the difference between a warm week & a miserable one.

I put in insulation in a crawl space and helped frame a house.





Fox and Geese

Technique - Pieced

Block Size - 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" *


Fabrics - I - white on white -

II - blue - your choice

Number of Pieces - 16

This is easily cut with a rotary cutter. The square (with seam allowance) is 3 1/2". The small triangle is a 3 7/8" square cut on the diagonal. The large triangle is a 6 7/8" square cut on the diagonal.
