COMMUNITY SERVICE

Hi Everyone,

Now that the Quilt Show is over we'll need to get going on this year's projects. For those new to the guild (and for those who have been with the guild for a while), here are some of the major things we do and that we currently need help with in order to get them done:

Painted Turtle Camp

1. **Small quilts** approx. size 36" x 45" up to 48" x 57" The boys and girls range from 7 to 17 yrs. in age.
2. **Bed Quilts** - 60" x 80". Some of these are 6 yrs old and looking very worn.
3. **Turtle Pillows** - They give one of these and a small cuddle quilt to each child that attends camp. They use about 2500 a year. We have patterns and kits for these for anyone that would like to help us with them.

Senior Center

1. **Placemats** 13-14" x 18" for the homebound in the area. The Center delivers approx. 350 Plus meals a day.
2. **Shawls** (26" x 65" and **small quilts (lap size)** to help keep them warm.

Animal Shelter

1. You can always make **cat pads** from your junk material 12" x 16 - 18" . for the bottoms of the cages.

Conkerr Cancer & Misc Storm related Projects

1. Some of us have been making **pillowcases** for the hospitals for cancer patients. This is ongoing and again we have the fabric and pattern for this project.

Veterans

1. We also have several things we'll be doing for our veterans throughout this year.

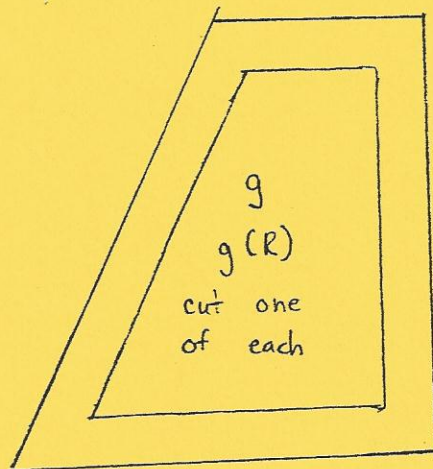
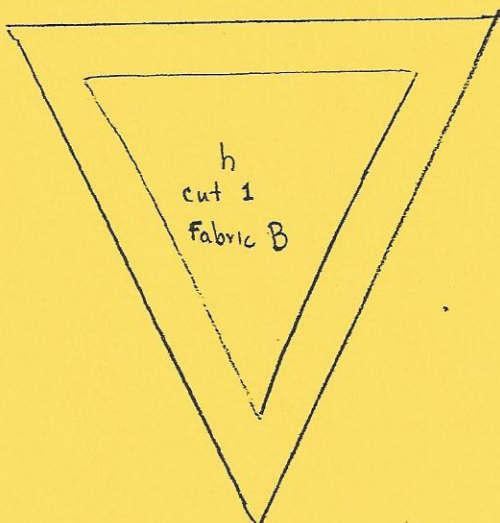
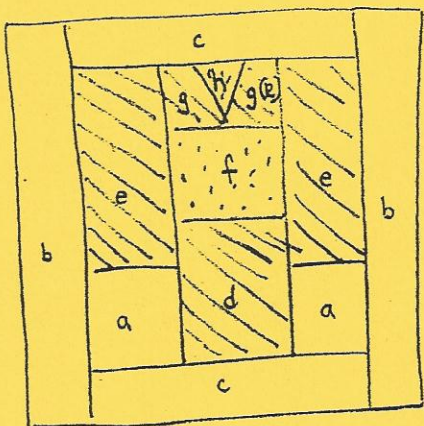
