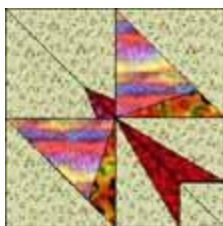
BOUTIQUE ITEMS NEEDED

Summer is almost here so let's get busy on those ongoing projects for our guild.

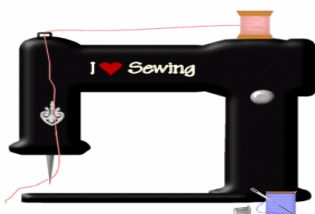

Fabrics- Red, White on White, and Blue

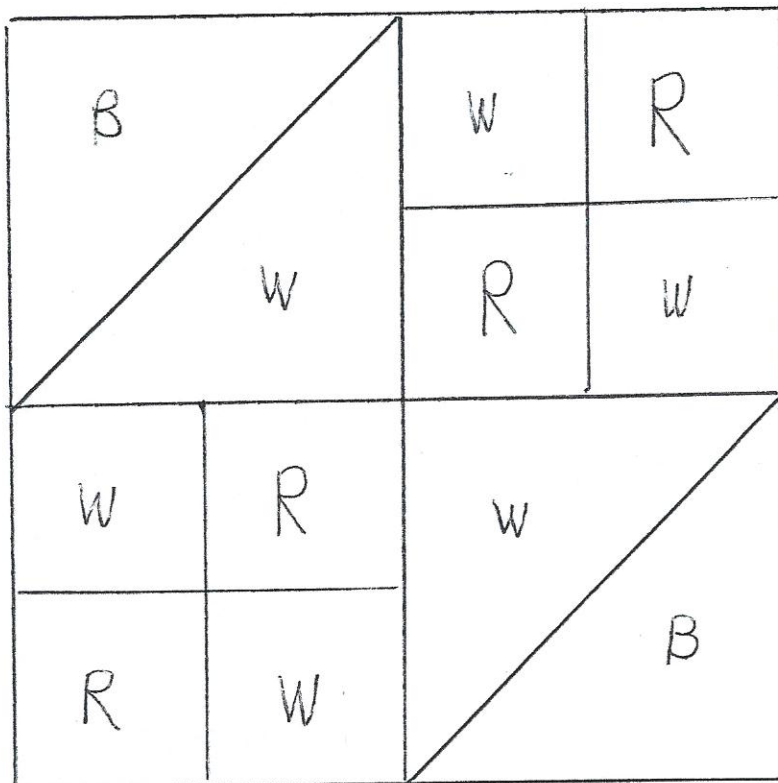
Cutting- Red 4 3 1/2" squares

4 3 1/2" sq.

Blue 1 6 7/8" sq.

Total pieces-12
