COMMUNITY SERVICE

We just want to thank all of you for all your work completing our guild's community service projects. We now have over 200 completed placemats for the senior center and still have more out there along with the senior shawls. We'll keep you updated on the count.

After the holidays we have some twin quilts ($60" \times 80"$) needing quilting, etc. These quilts are for the Veterans housed in Westwood and for the Painted Turtle Camp. The Painted Turtle has 60 additional beds that need to be covered this year so we need all the help we can get along these lines. For others wanting to do smaller projects, they always need the small cuddle quilts ($36" \times 47"$ and up in size) and the turtle pillows. Please see either me or Dana for the turtle patterns.

Another project the guild will be working on next year includes making simple aprons/bibs and lap covers to prevent food stains on the dining chairs of the L.A. Veterans Center. Modern Log Cabin Block


Technique-Pieced

Block Size- 10" x 10"

Fabric- Please use 3 different modern type fabric-they don't have to go together. They should be bold, bright and cheerful.

Cutting- Fabric A 1 6" sq. B 2 1½" x 6" 2 1½ " X 8 C 2 1½ " x 8 2 1½ " x 8 2 1½" x 10

Total pieces-9



Things to Remember:
