

#### SCVQG Block of the Month Oct. 2010

For Community Service - Rail Fence Flag

Technique-Pieced

Size- will be bigger than 12 ½" x 12 ½'- DO NOT TRIM DOWN

Fabrics- white on white or cream, red, and 2 different blues

Cutting: white or cream 6

6 6" x 1 7/8"

Red

6 6" x 1 7/8"

Blue A

1 6" square

Blue B

2 2" x 12 ½"

2 2" x 14 1/2"

#### Number of Pieces-17
