COMMUNITY NEWS

Community Service Support for Samuel Dixon Family Health Center

We have been hanging member quilts on the walls at this facility off Newhall Avenue (in the center next to Green Thumb) for the last two years. It is time to swap out the quilts. I have several quilts there now that need to be replaced with new ones to brighten the space. I went by to check sizes. They can make bigger rods, but in most cases, these are the practical maximum sizes for the quilts based on wall space:

Foyer: 5' wide by 7' long

Next to sign-in desk: 6'4" wide by 7' long

Two behind sign-in desk: Wall hangings

Dentist's Office - view from chair (children usually) 42" x 6'. Hardware is provided.

The quilts can be smaller, but need to be large enough to be viewed looking up. Except for the one in front of the dental chair - they are all hung near the ceiling. You can offer them for sale by leaving a price with the information in the contract. If you aren't planning to sell them, you need to figure a rough value based on the materials and any work you actually paid for such as quilting.

The health center does a formal contract that they developed with us to cover obligations by both parties. I spoke with Cheryl Laymon, the Executive Director for the facility. She is hoping that we are willing to continue to provide some bright spots for the visitors to the clinic.

HOSPITALITY NEWS

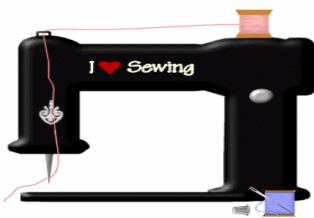
We send out a big thank you to all who brought food and drinks to the last meeting. They really gave us the energy to bid on all of those wonderful items!

Remember, we only have a few months left! We hope you are having as much fun meeting each month's challenge as we are.

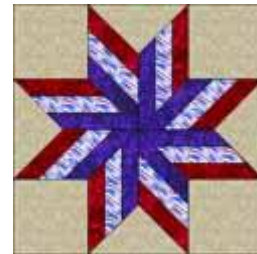

Technique-Pieced

Block Size- 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Fabric- white on white and Blue

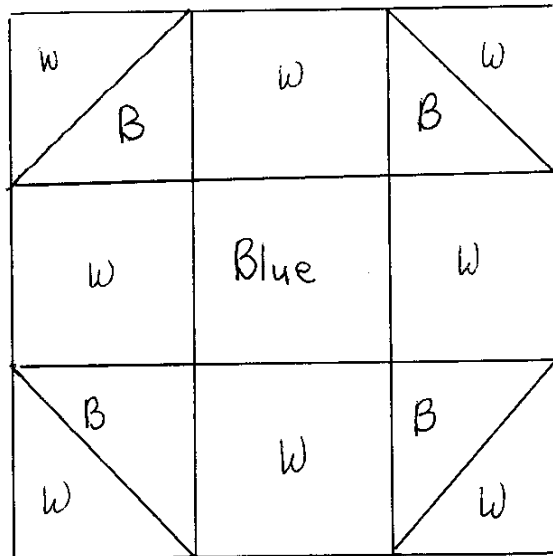
Cutting- white - 4 4 1/2" squares

2 4 7/8" squares cut on the diagonal

Blue 1 4 1/2" square

2 4 7/8" squares cut on the diagonal

Total pieces- 13
