We have a place and a date for our quilt show: Saturday April 21, 2012 at a lovely space in the Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha church on Copperhill at Seco, thanks to Barbara Montejo for arranging that! During the next 9 months, we will create all the committees necessary to put up a great show, and we will need your help! I have volunteered to chair the show and I would love to hear from you (via email or Facebook is BEST) if you are interested in any of the committees listed below, or if you have ideas for something new you want to see at our show.

Please come to our first **meeting on Thursday**, **Sept 22**, **7pm to 9pm at my house**: 25836 Via Candice, Valencia. I plan to have a very limited number of show meetings (perhaps five). I would LOVE to see some of our new members join us; it's a great way to meet folks in the guild.

Do any of these committees interest you? Don't worry; you won't be doing these things alone! I'm looking for Indians AND chiefs!

> • FRAMES: Move frames and tool box from storage to quilt show location, and then back again after show. A pickup truck is useful.

• HOSPITALITY: Set up hospitality area for guild volunteers and vendors (just light snacks, not lunch).

• PUBLICITY: Get show listings in Quilt magazines, local press and SCCQG meeting

• OUTDOOR SIGNS: Put up outdoor signage before and day of show. Includes facility location signs from Freeway and signage at location.

• BOUTIQUE: collect items from members for sale or raffle baskets. Arrange during the show, sell raffle tickets and small items.

• VENDORS: Responsible for all vendor contact before and during show. Sets price & size of booths, arrange for table rental if needed. Provide snacks for vendors, lunch delivery, change during the day.

• GUILD & LOBBY: Set up Guild information table and lobby table décor.

• DOORPRIZE: Collect door prizes from vendors; arrange door prize booth and distribution during the day.

• PHOTOS: Take photos of all quilts just before show opens, and then create CD for sale during the show. Computer skills necessary for this.

REGISTRATION & EXHIBIT: Create registration forms, set deadlines. Register quilts. Plot out hanging locations. Accept quilts at meeting before show; oversee hanging, take-down and distribution.

• CATALOG: Create printed catalog of quilts for distribution at lobby on day of show. Includes map and ballot.

• QUILT SIGNS: Create informational signs to hang near each near each quilt in show. Hang signs by 9am at the show. (Computer needed)

RIBBONS: Make ribbons for Chairs and Viewers choice

• LUNCH VENDOR: Arrange for a lunch vendor OR organize lunch items for sale at show. Arrange a seating area at the show.

• STAFFING: Get staffing requirements from each committee. Encourage guild members to signup. Establish staff sign-in process.

• TREASURER: Get change and cash boxes before the show. Pick up cash during the show and make deposits.
