Using the thread in the bobbin during initial stitching of the binding makes folding to top easier by pressing. The binding sticks to the top as a result and any decorative stitching or hand stitching can be a breeze. Paula Fleischer demonstrated how the mixture of traditional quilt blocks mixed with embroidered blocks takes it to another level in creativity. Joyce Wilkinson showed the proper preparation of quilt and backing to make the long arm quilting

Flower A 2 4 ½" squares Flower B 2 4 ½" squares


1 4 7/8" squares cut on the


