SCVQG Block of the Month May 2010 Single Irish Chain

Technique-Pieced

Size- 12 1/2 " x 12 1/2" unfinished

Fabrics- white on white and red print

Cutting: white on white 1 5 1/2" square

8 2 1/4" squares

Red

4 5 ½" x 4"

8 2 1/4" squares

Number of pieces- 21

COMMUNITY SERVICE SEW NIGHT

Cut 12 - 8 1/2" squares from novelty print

Cut 3 strips from Fabric A measuring 4 1/2" X 45"

Cut 3 strips from Fabric B measuring 4 1/2" X 45"

Sew A & B strips together

Sub cut A & B strips every 4 1/2"

Rotate colors & sew 2 sub cuts together making an 8 1/2" block.
