Thanks to the quick work of many of our guild members we were able to deliver 2 bed -sized as well as 8 lap quilts to the Veterans residential center in Westwood. The response by staffers as well as potential residents was heartwarming. One of our guild members told me they saw our quilts decorating the residents' rooms and common areas in a channel 2 news report. The VA is considering hosting a quarterly sewing meeting geared toward providing an ongoing supply of quilts for the veterans. All local guilds will be invited.

Thanks to so many of our very active guild members for returning the completed novelty quilt tops for children. Helena and I have pulled backing fabric and Carrie is cutting batting for them. If any of our long arm quilters have left over strips of batting they won't be using, we would love to have it to piece for our shawls, placemats etc. This can be cotton or poly....either works great.

We were blessed with 8 tops for the homeless quilts taken at the July meeting. We had 4 lap quilts taken for quilting ...yeah! This is a wonderful opportunity to polish your quilting skills while providing a finished quilt for donation.

We have several more ready for binding and quilting....

Lorraine and Rita had 9 placemats for SCV Senior Center turned in at the meeting. Our goal is two placemats per member. Yvonne and Judy had 3 homeless quilts completed and returned. We received 2 completed veteran lap quilts and 4 children's lap quilts. We have 10 senior shawls basted and ready to quilt. Please help us quilt these, you can do very simple quilting such as meandering, stitch in the ditch, or any simple quilting pattern.

We have been asked to participate in the "Grands Project" run by the

sheriff's department again this year. We will be collecting personal care products for the elderly. They have also asked us for the cute stickers we receive in our mail. You know the ones; they come with mailing labels from various organizations.

We have fabric for use on community service projects.


