PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our guild's business meeting last night devoted quite a bit of time to the guild's budget. We hope in coming months to bring specific information to members about things that affect our finances.

I expect it is no surprise that expenses have risen in recent years; certainly each of us experience this in our homes. The major impact on our guild is primarily lower income from our opportunity quilt ticket sales and quilt show profit, increasing expenses related to our speaker's fees, and miscellaneous increases in the cost of printing, postage, rent, storage, community service supplies, and reimbursing our members for expenses incurred.

What can we do?

I think it is important to keep annual dues at a reasonable rate. Regular membership is \$30 and senior membership is \$25. With that in mind, let's think about what areas we can improve and what would help.

If you can do anything to promote ticket sales for our Opportunity Quilt, think of a location or event where we could conduct sales it would be welcome news.

You can support our Ways and Means efforts by donating appropriate items to be placed up for the drawings, and even more important, purchase Ways and Means tickets at each meeting. The income generated makes a nice monthly contribution to our coffers. Can you donate new packaged serving materials like forks, spoons, napkins, and cups for our hospitality service? Can you donate items you may not need but are much needed by our community service volunteers?

On a brighter note, I have progressed nicely on my project for our Guild's Challenge which is due in November? Yes, I am bragging a bit, but I am safely tucked in at home where you can't smack me. Just a reminder that we are going to be visited by the Santa Clarita Valley Food Pantry at our September meeting so how about looking around your pantry or the store shelves for items you can bring for donation. If you would like to quilt the top you made we have pulled backing fabric and Carrie has cut batting for them.

We really appreciate receiving left over strips of batting you won't be using, we would love to have it to piece for our shawls, placemats etc. This can be cotton or poly....either works great.

We were blessed enough to have 2 lap quilts taken for quilting ...yeah! This is a wonderful opportunity to polish your quilting skills while providing a finished quilt for donation. We have several more ready for binding and quilting.

Lorraine and Rita had 20 placemats for SCV Senior Center turned in at the meeting. Our goal is two placemats per member. Yvonne and Judy had 1 homeless quilt top returned. We received 1 completed veteran lap quilt and 6 children's lap quilts. Senior shawls: We were able to add 6 quilted and bound shawls to our growing donation for the senior center.

October's block of the month will be put to use in assembling veterans quilts... be sure and participate.




