Recipes from our party!

Triffle

Duncan Hines brownie mix, made as directed for chewy brownies, with 1 tsp peppermint flavoring added

2 recipes chocolate pudding, with 1.5 tsp peppermint flavoring added

1 16 oz carton Cool Whip, flavored with 1 tsp peppermint flavoring (I would use 2 tsp next time), colored pink

crushed peppermint candies, approx 1/4-1/2 cup

Divide the brownies into thirds, break 1/3 into bite sized pieces into bottom of trifle dish Spread with 1/3 of pudding Sprinkle with candies Spread with 1/3 of Cool Whip Sprinkle with candies Repeat layers 2 more times Done Beautiful!

Vacuum Cleaner Cookies

1/2 c. margarine(not butter). melted 1(18.23 oz.) box of yellow cake mix 3 eggs

1 8 ounce pkg. of cream cheese, softened

1 1 pound box of powdered sugar

1/2 cup flaked coconut

1/2 cup chopped walnuts or pecans

Combine margarine, cake mix, and 1 egg. Stir together until dry ingredients are moistened. Pat mixture into bottom of well greased 15 x 10 jelly roll pan.

Beat remaining 2 eggs lightly, then beat in cream cheese, and powdered sugar. Stir in coccnuts and nuts.

Pour over mixture in jellyroll pan, spreading evenly. Bake at 325 degrees 45 to 50 minutes or until golden

brown. Cool pan on wire rake to room temperature. Makes 4 dozen bars.

GET YOUR RED, WHITE & BLUE BLOCK ON! Any appropriate red, white and blue fabric is fine.

Quilts of Valor Sawtooth Star 10° finished size block 10 % unfinished 13 %" – 14 %" unfinished size after adding sashing

QOV Instructions:


- QUV Instructions:

 1. Use 100% cotton, quilt store quality fabric that is pre-washed.

 2. Sew skimpy 1/2" seams to allow for the fabric lost in pressing

 3. Use particute colors to make the block. Background can be white cream, tan, beige, etc to co-ordinate with other fabrics.

 3. Use 2" or 2 1/2" strips to frame the block. Later the block will be trimmed to 12 1/3", but do not trim yet.



Cutting Instructions for Each Block:

Star Points	Cut eight squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"	Α (V.
Center Square	Cut one square 4 1/3" x 4 1/3"	E	}
Background - Corners	Cut four squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"		;
Sides	Cut four rectangles 3 1/2" x 4 1/2"	10)
Sashing for frames	Cut two rectangles 2" or 2 1/2" x	11"	
these do not have to be exact)	Cut two rectangles 2" or 2 1/2" x	15°	
	Star Points Center Square Background - Comers Sides Sashing for frames	Center Square Cut one square 4 %" x 4 %" Background – Corners Cut four squares 3 %" x 3 %" Sides Cut four rectangles 3 %" x 4 %" Cut two rectangles 2" or 2 %" x	Star Points

Sewing Instructions:











1. Using A and D, place A at left end of D. Sew diagonally from corner to corner as in diagram at left. Be sure to sew them all at the angle shown. The triangle will be more accurate if you sew along side the line from corner to corner to allow for the fabric lost in pressing. Press toward corner to make triangle. Trim excess, to leave ½ seam allowance. Repeat with the remaining A squares on the right side of D. Units should measure 3 ½ x 4 ½. Repeat to make four.



2. Lay out this air orentaining because as in drawing at ear. I will stogether in rows, pressing seams as indicated by arrows inside block diagram. Sew rows together and press away from center row as shown with arrows beside block. Trim to straight the edges if needed.

4. Do not trim. Later the blocks will be trimmed to 12 1/2".

Quality fabric does not have color run when washed.

Note:

- Use red or blue sashing (print ok).
- Block background can be red, white or blue.
- Use true 1/4" seams
- Be sure to attach identification tag with first and last name and city and state on EACH block with a straight pin.
