



Technique-Pieced

Size- 12 1/2" square unfinished

Fabric- light green and flower colored fabric Cutting- light green 2 7 " square cut

Diagonal

4 3/4" square 1


5 ½" square cut on both Diagonals(only 2 will be used)

Flower colored fabric 1

9" square cut on the diagonal

5 1/2" square cut on both 1 Diagonals (only 2 will be used)

Number of pieces-10
