Soft Art for the Patients

Maureen Micklich, the Development Coordinator for the Samuel Dixon Family Health Centers had contacted me to seek members that would display quilts in their patient center waiting areas. The first location we are looking at is in the new shopping center just north of Green Thumb Nursery in Newhall. It is a beautiful facility with at least one wall that is protected from direct sun and high enough that the quilt will not be touched.

It is their board's feeling that quilts are soft, calming, and bring a feeling of home to those that see them. I think we can all agree with this. If you would like to learn more about their centers, go to http://www.sdfhc.org When the facility has it's grand opening in about 8 weeks they would like to have a quilt hanging for display, and have the quilt changed out every couple of months. Their maintenance staff will work with the quilter to see that the quilt is hung properly and safely and do all of the ladder climbing. Quilts of Valor Bowtie Pattern

This block is a quick and easy one. Done in red, white, and blues it makes a fun pattern, no matter the setting.

The block is composed of 4 bowtie blocks, rotated townake an "X". Check out the fun quilt these X's make to the right.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

(Let's go scrappy - try to use all different reds and blues!)

- WHITE (Bleached Muslin, Tone-On-Tone, White Kona) (8) 3 1/2" squares
- (4) 3 1/2" squares RED: (4) 2" squares - draw a diagonal line on wrong side of fabric


MED/DARK BLUE:

- (4) 3 1/2" squares
 (4) 2" squares draw a diagonal line on wrong side of fabric

e. . . .

Begin by placing a RED 2" square, right sides together on top of a 3 1/2" WHITE square as shown. Stitch on the drawn line, trim 1/4" seam allowance, flip back and press.



Make 4 red squares

Repeat the above process to make BLUE units.



Make 4 blue squares

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:



Arrange your blocks and Red and Blue squares as shown to the left. Your finished block should measure 12 1/2".
