The Quilt meeting in November is the day to turn in your quilt, doll or garment for the show. Please have a 4-5" sleeve casing sewn onto the upper edge of the quilt for display (twin or larger). Provide any cords or special rod your quilt may need. Place an ID label on the back with your name, address, phone and quilt name.

Pickup will be as soon as the guild's show items are stowed, stacked or packed away in appropriate locations for transport back to storage for the next time. Volunteers who have signed up ahead of time will be given preference for pickup. Exhibitor's receipts with authorizing signatures must be presented at the time of pickup.

### The topic was Fund Raising

Hi fellow Santa Clarita Guild members! My sew buddy, Nancy Mayer, and I went to the council meeting hosted by the Friendship Square Quilt Guild in La Habra.

The council representatives divided up into 6 groups. Each group had to work on planning a fund raiser under different circumstances. My group's situation was a joint event fund raiser. This would be an event that would be planned by another group. The guild would take advantage of the location, publicity and the people that would be attracted to the other fund raising event.

The joint event functions or community tie-ins we came up with were: An art event, book store or restaurant opening, library event, church boutique or an annual community event.

Some of the lady's quilt guilds have been successful with raising money in the following ways:

- Home tours given by the Friends of the Library. The quilt group showed their quilts and helped sell tickets, helped with the setting up and got a percentage of the profit.
- Car shows.
- Getting the opportunity quilt to a community event.
- Having home tours of guild member's quilting rooms.

Now how do we find out about these? One good way is to find out from quilt guild members. Members could submit a list of organizations they are tied to.

The important things to remember in fund raising are plan ahead at least a year in advance, get your volunteers and have fun!
