## Trees — June and August

Cut Sky background 4 ½" x 6 ½"

Cut Ground background 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Make any tree you would like, keeping the background dimensions as shown. Unfinished tree block is 4 ½" x 8 ½" or double it and make a forest. Use a light weight iron-on product and applique tree down using your favorite method.




