Melissa Nilsen completed an awesome Friendship Quilt for the Opportunity Drawing and we have \$225 worth of gift cards (Panera, el Pollo Loco, Starbucks, McDonalds) for our ESOB (Extra Special Opportunity Basket) and now 6 vendors have signed up!!!

Check your schedules for June 12, 13, 14 for times you are able to volunteer at the quilt show. Lots of different choices and sign ups begin at the March Meeting.

Update on Signature Quilt: It is from 1930-40's from Plainview Arkansas. Of the 205 names on the quilt I have identified about 35 names. They are either connected with the Methodist

or Assembly of God congregation. I have made contact with a geneologist from Plainview who is helping me with resources. Put it on FB to see if I get any new connections. Theories about why the quilt was made include a fundraiser (paying a certain amount per signature) or a going away gift for a Methodist minister. Wait and see the next installment.

VETERAN'S PROJECTS

First, a big thank you to members who have been taking projects and returning them. We have added several wheelchair/lap quilts to the deliver and about 6 or 7 clothing protectors.

Kendra Geiger came over and we have cut up batting, cut backs and in most cases selected binding for over 10 wheelchair/lap quilts that need quilting done. They will be spray basted and available at our next meeting. Both the rehab and apartment complex would like this size quilt so I am saving a few for the Cal Vet homing. I have two larger bed quilts that need to be quilted expecting a mid to large quilting machine, these are not spray basted. There is also kits for tops that make various sizes including a number of bed quilts with some of our blocks from the block auctions of the past. Trimmed blocks, sashing, corner posts and borders are included in the kits as needed. Instructions for the expected work are included. I still have about 4 clothing protectors (vests) and will provide finishing instructions with them. I am planning on having more patterns if you wish to make your own, or, come shop with me in the fabrics we have available.

I will have a date by the next meeting for a delivery trip if anyone wishes to see the rehab facility or learn where the Cal Vet apartments are located.

GUIDE DOGS OF AMERICA QUILT

It is that time again - when we put our sewing skills and for some our love of dogs to the test and make blocks for the GDA quilt auction. This year we will be making two different blocks and to make them more cohesive, I am requesting specific styles and in some cases colors or dog prints.

Block 1 - Single Irish Chain. This block has an "x" through it of 2" finished squares. They should be a bright yellow. The other portions of the block should be a background like white to finish the four patch units (total of 4) with the yellow squares and an overall type of dog print as the 4 alternating squares. The center is a 4" square of the yellow but made with the 2" square shapes to emphasize the chain.

Block 2 - Dog Portrait. This block has a center that is a print of a dog head/full dog - a picture or it can be an applique. It should measure about 10" finished. The border will be a two inch finished square in each corner with complementary fabric for the 2 x 10" sashing.

A page with instructions and diagrams is provided. It is not to scale!

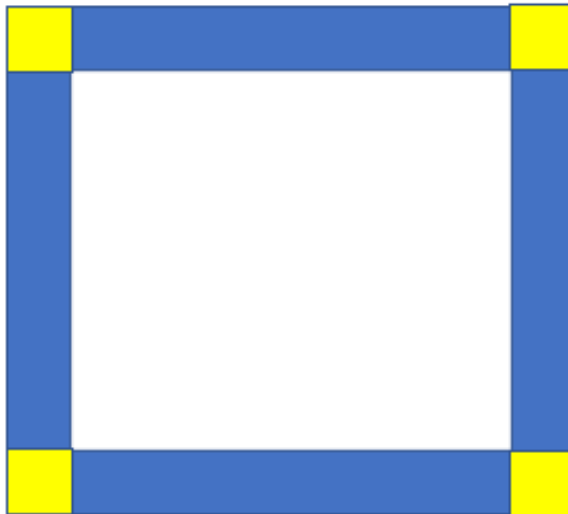

BLOCK 2 – Framed Dog Portrait

Measurement when complete – 12 ½" x 12 ½".



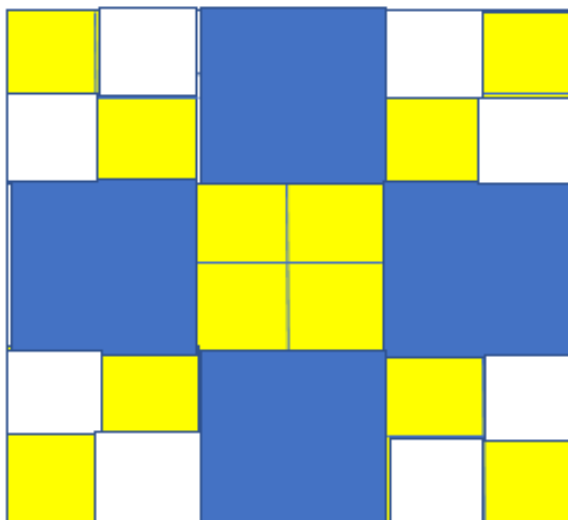
Yellow corner squares cut at 2 ½"

Blue sashing is cut at 2 ½" by 10 ½" and can be any complementary fabric that frames the inside

White center square is cut at 10 ½" x 10 ½" and can be a print with a full dog showing, a dog's head, an applique of a dog. Be creative but NO medium or small prints.

The quilt needs 25 blocks of which 23 are still needed.

BLOCK 1 – Single Irish Chain



Blue squares are cut 4 ½" x 4 ½" and will be from a small to medium dog themed print. Do not use portrait style prints as this will detract from the other blocks.

Yellow squares (12) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from a yellow or yellow print fabric

White squares (8) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from either the dog print used in the 4" squares or from a complementary background print.

The quilt needs 24 of these blocks

ASSEMBLY – will have 2" finished sashing of a complementary color or print. Cornerstones will be cut from a yellow print finishing at 2" to help the effect of the chain. 6" border of a dog print or complementary print will be added. Approximate finished size 112" x 112" or slightly larger.




