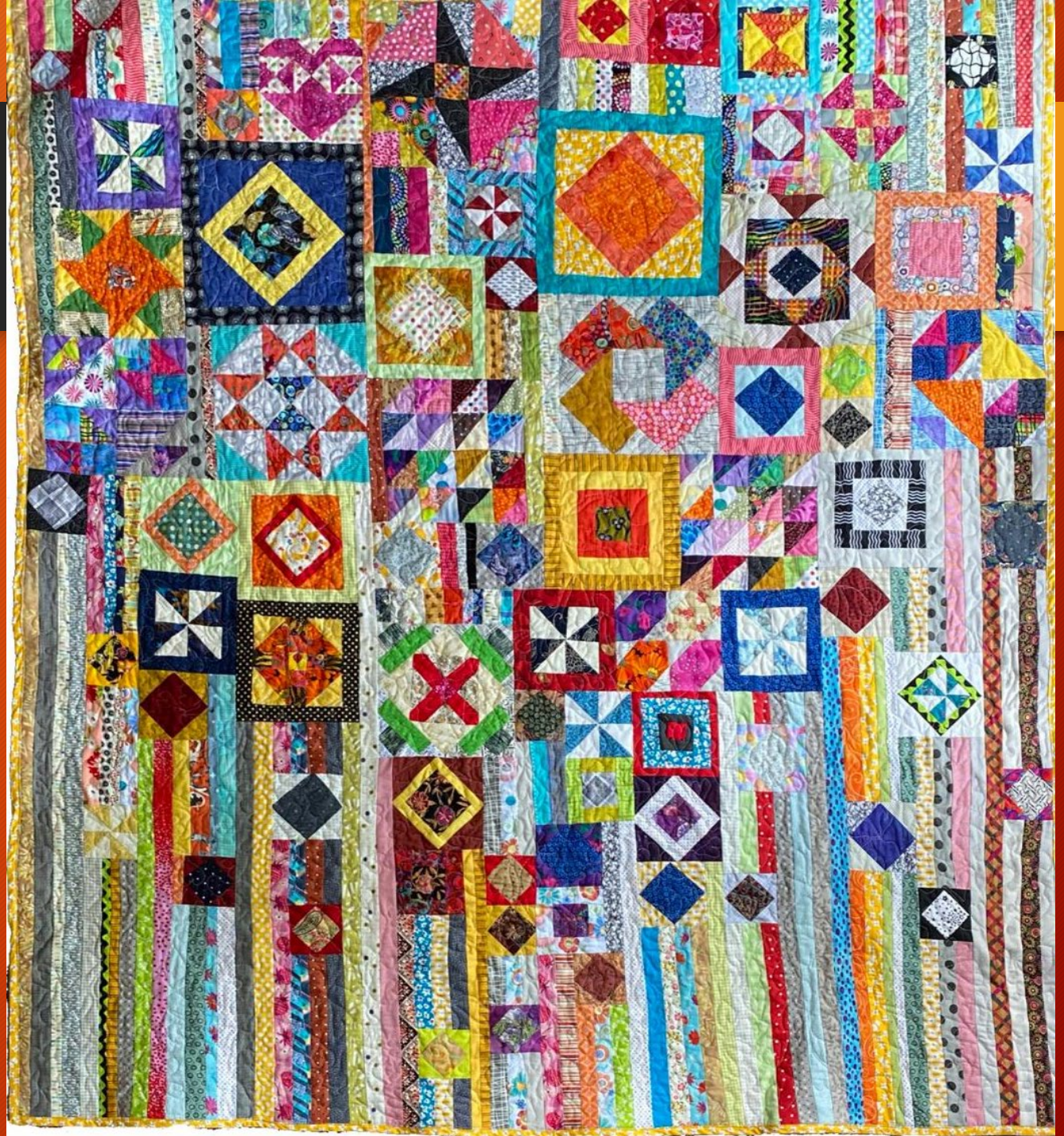

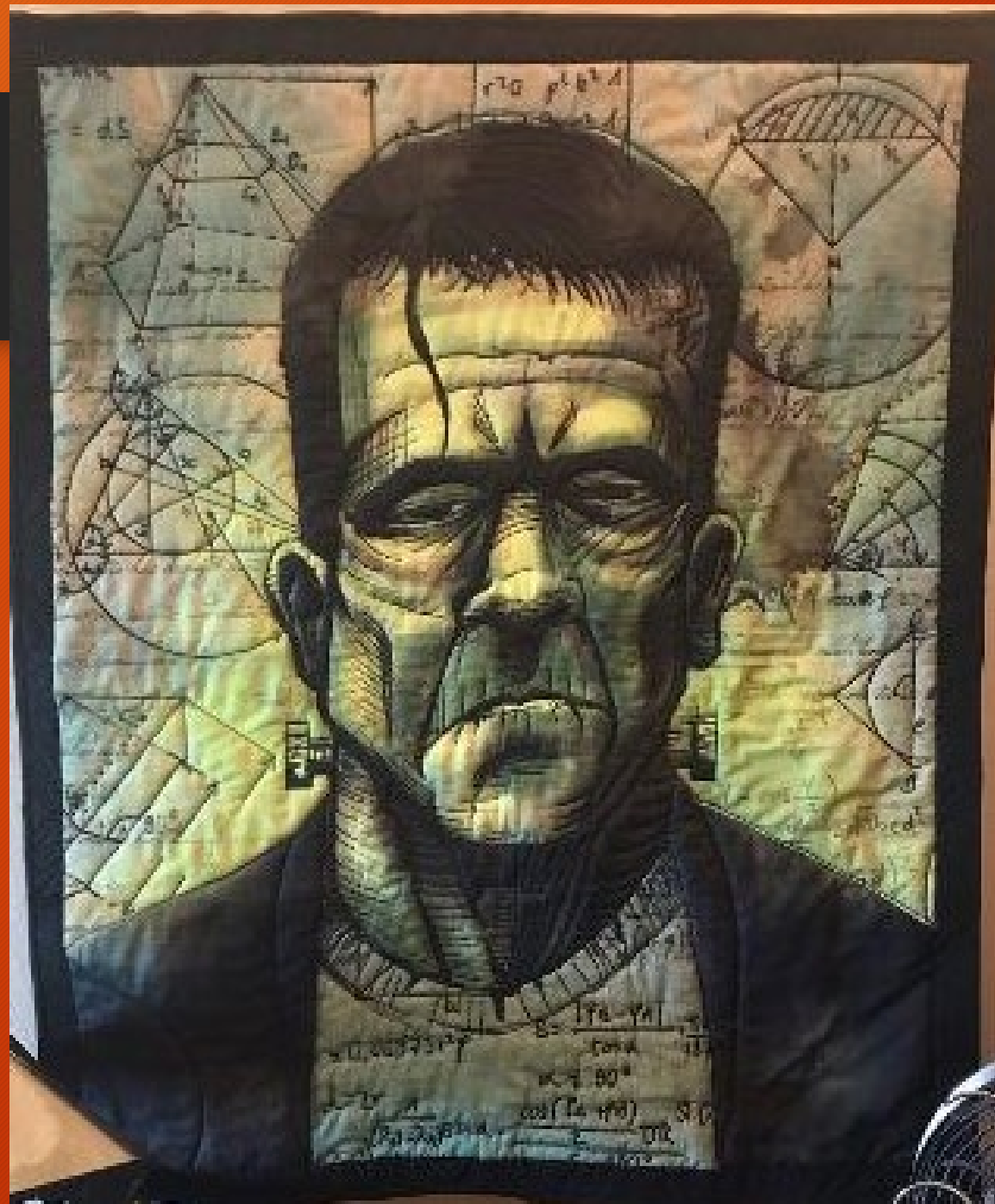
At a publisher seminar, I took a class from Louisa Smith with techniques in her book *Strips and Curves*. The quilts in her book are amazing. You basically use strips to build your fabric and then cut out the pies and L shapes and arrange them as you see fit. This reminds me of the con-trail out of an SR-71 (you need to see it to understand, balls of fire!
