Happy New Year—2024!!!

Thankfully we have had a much slower year this year as far as restoration goes. Completing the 1881 Jail and Littlejohn House, back to back, was quite an enormous task and has taken a long time to recuperate. However, it has been a very busy year and there never ceases to be an endless list of repairs that need to be completed. A large number of accessions have also come in during the past year and it was all we could do to get them cataloged and processed. If all were to be listed here, it would

take up three typed pages. Our curator was barely able to catch her breath.

We are very proud to have our outdoor restrooms refreshed with new flooring, countertops, and faucets. The Littlejohn brick side walk was also restored this year and we are very excited about getting it redone. It had become, in a very short time, unsafe due to faulty installation. A local museum patron, a retired brick mason, saw the poor condition and offered to help us. He also helped with other



brick repairs on the jail parapets, porch posts and yard clean up. A very unsightly pile of bricks from behind the Bethel church was hauled off with his help and also from the city crew. To them we say a big THANK YOU!!! The city is so good to help us anytime we call with a need.

In the near future the museum should be receiving a new historical marker plaque for the 1881 jail with the corrected information on it. By September, the THC notified the museum board that their application had been approved and the text of the marker was provided. It was approved by both the museum board and the Freestone County Historical Commission. The THC was to meet again in late fall for the final approval. We are still awaiting a reply from the THC.

We were very saddened just before Christmas to learn of the passing of Frank Dent, son on Mary Grace Lott Dent, who donated many items of his mother's collection to the museum. Then right after Christmas we learned of the passing of our friend Bing Smith, from the Littlejohn family, who was instrumental in the museum obtaining the Littlejohn Farm House. He was so very excited that day of the open house last fall. Both of these men will be greatly missed!

It's been a while since we sent out a newsletter. As postage continues to rise, the museum board has opted to only send out a printed newsletter via the US Postal Service at SPONSORSHIP RENEWAL TIME.
