Free Yard & Common Area Debris Collection

The Pinebrook HOA has been re-recognized as a Firewise Community for 2024. This recognition comes with an ongoing requirement to remove fire fuels year-after-year. Last spring/summer, we focused on clearing out the weeds & fire fuels that were on the common areas. This year we will shift back to focus on resident properties. The HOA will have a 20' yard debris container placed in the common area north of Pinebrook, between Hitching Post & Trailblazer (same place as last year) on April 16th. We will swap the 1st container with an empty 2nd container a week after the 1st container is placed. A 3rd container will be placed if there is a demand for it. Please help us fill up the containers with yard debris from your property & the common area adjacent to your property. These containers are the result of a grant awarded to us by Deschutes County (no charge to our HOA).

FireFree days (no charge to dump yard debris) at Knott Landfill will run from May 3rd – May 12th this year, if you would like to drop off your yard debris yourself.

If you don't have one already, please consider renting a yard debris bin from Cascade Disposal through September (fire season).

Free Firewood

New Weed Taking Over Central Oregon (& our HOA property)

Besides the primary scourge of our HOA & much of the world (Cheatgrass), we have a new weed in town - it's called Bur Chervil (the smaller cousin of Wild Chervil). Info on it can be found at: https://extension.wsu.edu/whitman/2013/11/bur-chervil-wild-chervil/

Please help us keep it under control. For those who don't want to use a herbicide on it, or other toxic/non-native/invasive weeds, a safe alternative is 30% vinegar.



Fire Threat from the East

More work was done last fall in the SE common area to reduce the threat of a fire coming in from the land east of our HOA, south of Pinebrook. More dead trees will be cut down in that area this spring. Many residents have expressed concern regarding the homeless people camping on the land east of our common area & the fires that they make getting out of control. The aforementioned landowner has given the Board members the authority to call the Bend Police Dept. & ask them to ask the homeless people to move on. The City of Bend passed a law requiring that a call be made to the Police Dept. for EACH incidence of 'squatting'. So, if you notice people camping on that land, especially if they have a fire burning, please notify the Board via E-mail (address below) immediately.

More on Dead Trees

Some residents have dead trees on their property – please cut them down by the end of May.

Common Area Encroachment

There are a few instances of residents encroaching upon common area with vehicles & more. Please move them back onto your own property. Thank you.
