Where are we going fishing?

Where are going to go fishing this time? This is the question we ask ourselves every fall to begin our thinking for a schedule the next year.

We have chosen to ask our members to list and/or rank your preference to lakes that we typically have fished before. We believe this should give us our best chance of selecting those lakes you, our members, have confidence in to catch fish.

Upon receiving your selections, we, the Planning Committee, collate and list the lakes in order of preference for us to take into account when making the final decisions for the schedule.

Once we have a listing of the lakes, we then try to place the lakes into the schedule based upon many factors that will provide us the best chance of having a good fishing outing. This list considers many factors but is not all inclusive.

- Away lakes
- Availability of restaurants and hotels
- Local lakes
- Cooling lake versus not a cooling lake
- Time of year for specific lakes
- Other boating traffic
- DNR requirements
- Ramp conditions and accessibility
- Possibility of flooding

- HP limitations
- Ramp fees and/or permit fees

Upon consideration of these factors, we assign lakes to a month in the calendar. We then review the month for holidays, possible vacation times, Park District functions, and assign a weekend to have the fishing outing. Our tentative selections are presented to the members for their consideration and comments. Once a schedule is completed, the Planning Committee Chairman applies for a permit via the DNR and their approval. This approval is on a first come – first served basis.
