Things to Do in the Off-season

For those that are not fishing all year round here are a few things to do to help pass through the "winter blues".

Organize your stuff

Although you may not be able to get to your boat, there are still a number to things you can do. If you are like me, you don't always put back tackle in an organized fashion at the end of the year. How far you go with this depends on how obsessed and anal you are. Make everything easily assessable and ready to tie on and cast within a minute or two. It sucks when you think you know where you placed your favorite lure only to find out when you are fishing that you misplaced it and you waste time tearing your tackle box apart looking for it. You say you are already organized? This next tip may hurt a little, but as a fisherman, we are hoarders; it's built into our DNA. There are lures

that you haven't used in years. Get rid of it. Collect all that stuff and bring it to our Swap Meet. You may make a few extra dollars and save fuel costs by eliminating that extra weight in your boat.

Pre-Plan your Season

Now is the time if you know where and when you are going to plan your hotel stays, how to get there, read past fishing reports about the area, study maps, etc. Do your research now while you can instead of trying to make time right before a trip.

Learn to use that Fish Finder

Most of our Fish Finders are removable. Invest in a AC to DC power converter. You can then power up your Fish Finder and play with it while sitting in your favorite lounge. Have your manual handy and go through all the functions. Setup your screens the way you want to see them. With a Navionics Chip, you can use your screen cursor and move it to your favorite lake and study the contours and other features.

Practice

It's easy to set up a practice area in your garage or basement. How many times you missed your mark last season? Here is the time to practice that pitching. Place a bucket or some cups of various sizes in around and under stuff. Practicing can save you money too. How many lures you lost by getting them stuck in a tree or on shore and you couldn't retrieve them. With lures costing sometimes around \$6 or \$7 (or even a lot more), the costs add up fast. If you always wanted to learn to cast better with your other hand, here's the time to practice that too.
