And she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn.
~ Luke 2:7

As Catholics, we understand that Advent and Christmas are about creating space, inner space, to house the child Jesus in our hearts and souls. We reject the limitations of the seemingly callous innkeeper. History is not kind to the man who couldn't find safe space for Jesus and his family.

For me, with age and through work as a trauma therapist, the desperate flesh and blood needs presented in the nativity story speak to me and compel my focus outward. Jesus, like all children, needed to be welcomed, protected, sheltered, fed and comforted. There are an estimated two thousand children in detention facilities at the border with these needs. Please consider a donation to the charity that would do the work you would do at the border.

Save the Children or the ACLU Foundation, just to mention two, work to provide justice and basic care for these children.

Seven children, that we know of, have died in detention. The most recent fatality was Carlos Hernandez Vasquez, 16, from Guatemala. Carlos died alone on the filthy concrete floor of a quarantine cell with nothing but a foil sheet. The others are Darlyn Cristabel Cordova-Valle, 10; Marijee Juarez, 1; Jakelin Caal Maquin, 7; Felipe Gomez Alonzo, 8; Juan de Leon Gutierrez, 16; and Wilmer Josue Ramirez Vasquez, 2½.

They are also named Jesus. We remember them.


Parish News
