### Readings for Sunday, April 5

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. There are two Gospels proclaimed at today's Mass. The first Gospel tells of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, followed by the stark account of Jesus' passion.

# Growing in Faith Reflection

The Growing in Faith Bulletin Committee offers a special reflection for this Palm Sunday: Pope Francis wrote this for last year's Palm Sunday. It seems so appropriate for our own situation this Holy Week as we join all those suffering the loss of a loved one and pray for our world.

"Jesus shows us how to face moments of difficulty and the most insidious of temptations by preserving in our hearts a peace that is neither detachment nor superhuman impassivity, but confident abandonment to the Father and to his saving will, which bestows life and mercy.... By his entrance into Jerusalem, he shows us the way. For in that event, the evil one, the prince of this world, had a card up his sleeve: the card of triumphalism. Yet, the Lord responded by holding fast to his own way, the way of humility."

Triumphalism tries to make it to the goal by shortcuts and false compromises... It lives off gestures and words that are not forged in the crucible of the cross; Jesus destroyed triumphalism by his Passion. Jesus knows that true triumph involves making room for God and that the only way to do that is by stripping oneself, by self-emptying. There is no negotiating with the cross: one either embraces it or rejects it. By his self-abasement, Jesus wanted to open up to us the path of faith and to precede us on that path."
