Renew My Church Decision

Last Friday evening, the decision of Cardinal Cupich on the future makeup of our grouping of parishes, St. Jerome, St. Ignatius, and St. Gertrude, was presented in a virtual meeting by our local bishop, Bishop Bartosic. Links to the documents and a recording of the live-streamed event are available below in this newsletter, as well as on the parish website. I encourage you to read the document to gain a fuller understanding of the decision.

Both St. Gertrude and St. Jerome will remain as separate parishes, as we have been. St. Ignatius will cease to exist as a parish by July 1, 2021. And all regular Masses and other services will cease no later than the First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2021. After St. Ignatius stops being a parish, the campus will be within the newly-expanded boundaries of St. Gertrude, which will also have responsibility for its upkeep until a decision is made about the property and

Or, unfortunately, sometimes those are missing, and we start life with a negatively skewed view of reality.

Similarly, it is always first and foremost the people who are closest to us that can give us the most support or cause us the most pain as we go through life. Perhaps this is a good week to remind ourselves that the basis of all loving relationships is the practice of forgiveness -- both giving it and receiving it when it is offered. Nothing so helps us continue growing than that aspect of love -- the giving and receiving of forgiveness.

St. Gertrude Parish Auction 2021

Here are some COVID protocols observed in church now:

- Enter the church via the Granville (handicap access) door.
- Everyone must wear a mask.
- Leave home early enough to allow for the check-in procedure.
- You must not exhibit any signs of COVID-19 related illness.
- Once you are admitted, your temperature will be taken and you will need to sanitize your hands.
- Your reservation will be checked and an usher or greeter will take you to a seat. (Those living in the same households can sit together.)
- Everyone in church is expected to maintain safe-distancing protocols by observing the markings on the floor and in the pews which give directions for spacing and traffic flow.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

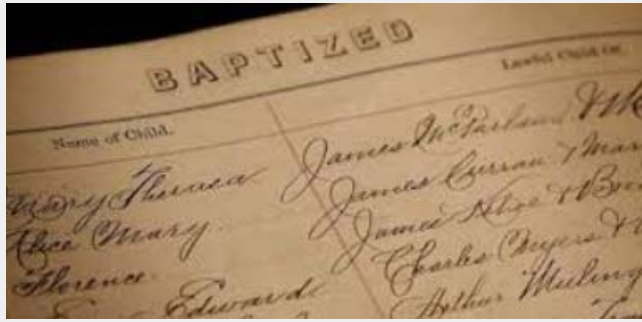
