Next Sunday, April 25, I will preside at the 9:00 am English language Mass and all of us will again be available at a gathering for St. Ignatius parishioners after the Mass.

In the next few weeks, we will share some dates when we have invited St. Ignatius parishioners to visit St. Jerome and/or St. Gertrude parishes to see if they are interested in joining either parish.

As we have been discussing since this initiative began, while we expect most of the Spanish-speaking parishioners to transition to St. Jerome and most of the English-speaking parishioners to transition to St. Gertrude, it is up to each parishioner to make their own determination. For parishioners with children, Religious Education may be a significant part of the decision-making process. Families may choose to join St. Jerome, where they have the option of a Spanish-language R.E. program and worshipping in Spanish. Or if they prefer an English-speaking R.E. program and worship in English, they may opt to join St. Gertrude.

Special thanks to the volunteers from the Parish Pastoral Council and Renew My Church groups who will be representing St. Gertrude at these initial gatherings and will be the coordinators of our hospitality for the St. Ignatius parishioners when they come to visit. This same group of volunteers will be part of a team composed of representatives from the other parishes, as well as representatives from Loyola University and the Jesuit Community at Loyola as we consider the possibility of a joint Mission Center involving the parishes and the university.

It was so great to see so many people in church for Holy Week and Easter! Many of these faces have not been able to be with us since everything was shut down back in March of last year. So we were all happy to be back together to share our prayers and best wishes! With each passing day and more people getting vaccinated, I hope our return to whatever the new normal isn't too far away! In the meantime, let's all keep following the advice of the people who know what they are talking about and keep wearing masks, sanitizing hands, and maintaining social distancing.



Growing in Faith

St. George, Pray for us!

On Friday, April 23, the Roman Catholic sanctoral calendar invites us to contemplate the courage of St. George, a Christian Roman military officer who literally lost his head in 303 AD when he refused to offer sacrifices to pagan gods. After his death, people told stories of this martyr and of the many other people who died in Roman persecutions.

Two centuries later, Pope Gelasius I recognized the faithful's growing devotion to this military man of conscience. They had come to venerate him as one of their holy patrons, protectors to whom they could turn in times of great need. The pope declared this martyr as being among those "whose names are justly reverenced among men, but whose acts are known only to [God]."

St. George's skimpy biography has not deterred the faithful of many generations who have since venerated him as a man of conscience, a protector against evil. The legend of St. George and the Dragon may be the

only reference point for most of us since this saint is commonly depicted slaying that mythical creature on English flags, Orthodox icons, and medieval paintings.

Perhaps this week, though, we might take a moment to reflect on, to pray for, and to thank the dragon slayers in our midst today. May the unsung frontline and behind-the-scenes heroes of this pandemic "whose acts are known only to [God]" experience abundant blessings, support, and protection in their own times of need.

Chicago Vaccine Angels Will Help

Seniors and Essential Workers Schedule a Vaccine

If you or a loved one aged 65 and over are having difficulty finding a vaccine, or have trouble using a computer to book one, a group called Chicago Vaccine Angels will help you. Started by an Evanston teen in February, the group has booked over 4,000 people for vaccines in the Chicago area for free.

The team is working on booking anyone who is currently eligible to receive the vaccine; however, there are eligibility differences between Chicago and the rest of the state. The following form will have different eligibility options based on where you live.

Appointments generally book no more than a week in advance, and often only 1-3 days out. If you aren't available until a date more than a week away, please wait to sign up until you are available. Please fill out this google form for help. The group asks that if you have tech-savvy, please attempt to schedule your own vaccine. Another option to consider is the FEMA-operated site in Gary that is available to all.

Please note the following:

- The group will not re-book appointments that were made if you have significant schedule or location constraints, please ensure they are marked in the form!
- If you have received a J & J appointment, another appointment will not be booked for you. If you are scheduled to receive a J & J appointment, the vast majority of those vaccines have been switched out for Pfizer or Moderna.

- No vaccine hunter should ever ask for your Social Security number or money.
- If we book for a 16-17-year-old, a parent MUST accompany the teen to the appointment. Please note, most suburbs are allowing 16-17-year-old to be vaccinated if the Pfizer vaccine is offered. In Chicago, 16-17-year-old may receive a Pfizer vaccination after Monday, April 19. Most appointments indicate which injection they plan to give when booking vaccine appointments.
- You cannot request one vaccine brand over another.
- Due to the nature of the current pandemic, there is no assurance that they will be successful in booking your appointment.
- Your personal information shall be accessible only to the volunteers that are a part of the Chicago Vaccine Angels. Your personal data will not be sold. De-personalized data may be used by us to enhance the efficacy of this program.
