These moments coincide with the <u>upcoming 60th-anniversary of</u> the ordination of Fr. Bill Kenneally! Fifty or sixty years was once considered a long time to live! Now it is an even more amazing gift when it is a lived commitment, made in love, that lets the love of God and power of God's grace shine through all these faith-filled witnesses!

We often refer to this Sunday in the Easter season as Good Shepherd Sunday because of today's gospel passage, in which Jesus makes the simple declaration, "I am the Good Shepherd." As such, he lays down his life for the sheep, he never abandons them, he knows them and they know him, he brings all the sheep together and willingly gives up his life out of love for them.

This is also Vocation Sunday. This celebration is not meant to be limited to religious vocations for priests and men and women religious, it is meant to be a celebration of all the vocations available to us for living our lives. This weekend is all about love and commitment. Whether or not that choice is as a vowed or ordained minister in the church, as a part of a loving, committed couple, or as a single person pursuing a life of service to others, living that call (vocation) in love and commitment helps us to be the person God has created us to be.

Length of time, of course, is not a guarantee of witness to such a relationship. It is usually a pretty good indicator if those achieving those kinds of anniversaries are also individuals and couples infused with a profound sense of joy and fulfillment, regardless of what they have had to deal with throughout their lives. When it is a couple in a relationship, it usually means they have learned that love only continues to grow when the commitment to each other encourages the regular practice of forgiveness. And that the relationship is not two-way, but three-way -- with God the third part of that relationship. Similarly, in single people sharing their love and life with others, they are never alone because God is always their partner.

Recently, I was meeting with three generations of a family who had come in to plan a memorial Mass for their husband, father, and grandfather. As we were wrapping up our planning, I felt it was important to say to the adult-children of the widow and her late husband that it was so fortunate for them that they had been gifted with such good parents. To which they

immediately responded that they knew how blessed they were. It was so obvious in the way they spoke with and to each other, in what is never a pleasant chore -- planning a funeral -- that they loved and respected each other and the most important gift their parents had passed on to them was the deeply rooted loving commitment which they were now able to share with their spouses and children.

I think the greatest indicator of a true vocation lived out as fully as possible is indicated by the profound sense of joy those with such a vocation exhibit every moment of every day, regardless of what things -- good or bad -- are going on in any given moment. And I have come to believe that no one thing better ensures the ongoing presence of that joy than living out the essential practice of love - which is forgiveness, commitment, and making the time to listen and be present to others.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, congratulations to all those who are living and celebrating their vocation! May you continue, with your lives, to inspire others to embrace their own vocation and share the loving commitment which makes God's love present among us! Thanks to all of you for your amazing witness!

Finally, the work of living out a vocation is always strengthened when family members, friends, and neighbors express support. Today would be a great day to tell someone you have admired how much it means to your own life that they are living their vocation so well. And it is always a good time to invite anyone -- but especially young people, to consider how they might best live out their lives in a loving and committed way.

Rectory Office Update


You may remember some weeks ago we announced that our business

Growing in Faith

Finding Courage

Peter, the once faint-hearted denier, in Sunday's reading shows astonishing courage. He fearlessly castigates the "leaders of the people and elders" for their role in the crucifixion of Jesus: "He is the stone rejected by *you*, the builders, which has become the cornerstone." (Acts 4:10). Even after being arrested and severely warned against teaching in the name of Jesus, Peter is undeterred, responding to their threats by saying, "You must judge whether in God's eyes it is right to listen to you and not to God." (Acts 4:19). Having experienced the resurrected Christ, Peter is not the man he was before.

I recently saw "A Hidden Life," a film based on the real-life story of an Austrian farmer, Franz Jagerstätter, whose lonely refusal to pledge loyalty to Hitler led to his incarceration and eventual execution. He takes his stand while everyone else in his village is willing, either from personal assent or fear of the consequences of refusal, to sign an oath of fealty to Der Führer. Even when pressed to comply by his bishop, Jägerstätter, being a person of faith, cannot ignore his inner voice. He simply states, "I cannot do what I know to be wrong." The church beatified him in 2008.

Peter and Franz, the most ordinary of persons in all respects, showed extraordinary courage of conviction when it counted. They left us an example. When called upon in everyday life or in "a moment of truth," I pray for some measure of their resoluteness and courage.

There will be an in-person rehearsal for First Communion on **Thursday**, **May 6 at 6:30 pm in the church**. Lasting about an hour, the kids will practice the processional, recessional, and how to come forward for Communion. Families are asked to bring the banner they made, it will be

hung on the pew reserved for your Communicant and family. The banners will stay at church until after the First Communion Mass.




Please Welcome our New Parish Business Manager, Eduardo Soto
