

Growing in Faith

There's a wonderful image in this weekend's first reading which starts with Isaiah saying he's doomed because he is "a man of unclean lips." So, God sends an angel with an ember from the altar fire to cleanse Isaiah's lips. That sound like a pretty painful thing to undergo, and maybe it's a reminder that following God is no picnic.

But it's only part of the lesson, this cleansing of Isaiah's sin. The second part is God asking: "Whom shall I send?" Who will deliver God's message? And the prophet answers: "Here I am. Send me."

A common misunderstanding of saints is to think of them as perfect plaster statues. Not true, as anyone who's ever been called a saint will tell you. We're all sinners — you, me, and everyone else. We're all saints, too. Or, at least, we can choose to act like saints.

Peter knows how flawed he is when, in the gospel, he tells Jesus, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Paul, in the epistle, has the same message: "I am the least of the apostles."

Yet, Peter was the rock on which Jesus built the Christian community. And Paul was the one who travelled the world to share the good news.

When it comes to being a human being, flaws and imperfections and sin are part of the job description. Well, actually, the job description is to recognize these failings and to find a way to rise above them to do good in the world, to love and be loved.

Midwest Workers Association Super Bowl Sunday Tamale Benefit - Place Your Orders This Weekend in the Back of Church

The Midwest Workers Association (MWA) is a free and voluntary membership association of low-income workers in the Chicago area. Members help other members meet survival needs while fighting to eradicate government policies that have led to job losses, poverty wages, home foreclosures, utility shutoffs and denial of health care.

The public health and economic crisis has forced thousands more low-income working families to face the untenable "choice" of heating their homes or feeding their children. We invite you to join MWA in helping to stop the winter death toll!

MWA's Super Bowl Tamale Benefit generates critical support for our Winter Survival Campaign. The campaign includes winter door-to-door membership canvasses, utility bill advocacy (to stop shutoffs and restore service for members), warm coat & blanket distributions, check-in calls to

members and more.

MWA volunteers will be in the back of church this Saturday, February 5 evening and Sunday, February 6 after Mass to take orders. Tamales will be brought to St. Gertrude the following weekend, Saturday, February 12 and Sunday, February 13 for pick-up after Masses.

The suggested donations for the homemade tamales are \$10 for a half dozen and \$20 for a dozen, with all monies raised going to support their Winter Survival Campaign. There are three kinds to choose from and they come in half-dozen bags of a kind. Choices include chicken in a green sauce, vegetarian "queso y rajas" (cheese & jalapeno), and vegan black bean & cactus.

North Side Community Mask Drive: Masks and Cleaning Supplies Needed for Area Students

North Side Community Mask Drive is a community wide effort to collect child-size respirator masks, child-size surgical masks, and cleaning supplies

and distribute them to local neighborhood schools facing urgent need. The NS Community Mask Drive is currently partnering with local businesses, as well as the Edgewater Community Religious Association (ECRA), which includes St. Gertrude parish.

The group is collecting:

- Child-size N95/KN95/KF94 masks (also accepting adult sized masks for older kids)
- Child-size surgical masks
- Clorox/disinfecting wipes
- Hand sanitizer

Mission Trip to Lake Traverse, South Dakota


The youth group's Summer Mission Trip will be July 17-22. The group will travel to Lake Traverse, South Dakota. All teens in grades 7-12 who attend parish youth group meetings regularly are welcome to take part in this jampacked week of service, friendship, and fun! Space is limited.

The cost is \$379 per person, not including transportation. A nonrefundable \$50 deposit is due by Sunday, February 13, 2022. A nonrefundable half payment of \$100 is due by Monday, February 28. The final payment deadline date will be shared in the future. We are organizing some fundraising events to offset these expenses.

Please consider two factors when deciding about the Mission Trip - the pandemic is likely to still be ongoing in July and we are traveling to and from South Dakota in a passenger van. (A close space considering the pandemic).
