Today we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost -- the fulfillment and the conclusion of the Easter Season! First, I want to congratulate all the young people who are being confirmed at the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday and the 10:30 am Mass on Sunday. They step forward after their two years of preparation, exploring what the sacrament means, their involvement in service projects, selecting their Confirmation names, etc.

As we see throughout our Scriptures, we take a new name when we enter into a new relationship with God and with each other. Saul became Paul. So today the Confirmands take their new name. This marks their openness to God's Spirit being alive and active in their lives, changing their reality. Congratulations to all the newly confirmed!

Pentecost is always a reminder for all of us that, having received everything we need from God when Jesus sent the Holy Spirit upon us, we now need to fan into a greater fire the flame of that Spirit in our lives. We need to gather that Spirit together and take it out to the world so in need of its positive message of God's hope, God's peace, God's love available to us in our own world.

Updated COVID Protocols

I apologize for what is some confusion about protocols these past few weeks. As you are probably aware from the news, the CDC issues some general guidelines. Then the Governor and state set most of the protocols. But then the City of Chicago and Mayor have some more restrictive protocols. And the Archdiocese, working with both of those levels of government, has tried to clarify all the changes to implement them in all the parishes.

In the minor changes we received last week (e.g. Ministers of Communion no longer need to wear a face shield when giving Communion but will continue to wear face masks.), the memo also mentioned we would soon be receiving protocols for vaccinated and unvaccinated and what we will be doing about masks if anything.

Some of the confusion is also because of the shifting of what age groups can be vaccinated. Fortunately, everyone 12 and older are now able to be

vaccinated. As Pope Francis continues to remind us, every person, unless there are medical issues, has a moral obligation to be vaccinated not only for their own health but for the health of all those they may encounter. If you haven't already done so, please get vaccinated!

Next weekend is the Memorial Day weekend -- the unofficial start of summer! The Rectory office will be closed on Monday, May 31 for the holiday. On Wednesday, June 2nd, NCA will celebrate graduation at a special Mass at 6:00 pm at the Holy Child of Jesus (formerly known as St. Margaret Mary church.)

Growing in Faith

Pentecost ideally should be our year-round mindset. Today's Psalm proclaims that God will continue "to send forth the Holy Spirit...to renew the face of the earth." When we are open to receive the Holy Spirit, we are able to move far beyond normal limitations to build God's Kingdom both individually and communally in extraordinary ways.

Praying daily to be filled with the Holy Spirit is a wonderful next step on the path to holiness. As part of your prayer life, I suggest memorizing the list of the nine virtuous behaviors found in Galatians 5:22 called “The Fruit of the Holy Spirit”: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Then call them to mind often and assess where you want to improve.

I came to an adult understanding of the Holy Spirit about 35 years ago. Then about a dozen years ago, I prayed for an overflowing of the Holy Spirit, and I was blessed with a strong desire to better know Scripture. Being more deeply involved in His Word has transformed my life.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit is an especially powerful collective experience. We have that opportunity now! St. Gertrude is partnering with our two neighboring parishes in Rogers Park to “Renew My Church” as we consolidate and move forward. Let us pray for an outpouring of the Spirit to “Renew the face of the earth.” Collectively we must ask the Spirit that we are graced with living a full life of faith. Come, Holy Spirit, Come!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Six years ago, Pope Francis issued the groundbreaking encyclical *Laudato Si'*. "I urgently appeal," he wrote, "...for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all." As Catholics, we are called to be stewards of all of God's creation. By protecting our planet and all of its inhabitants, we show our love for each other and our Creator.

During the week of May 16-24, Catholic communities throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago are invited to participate in "*Laudato Si'* Week" to mark its sixth anniversary. Pastors are encouraged to preach on the importance of caring for God's creation and promoting an integral ecology and include intentions for the healing and restoration of our common home.

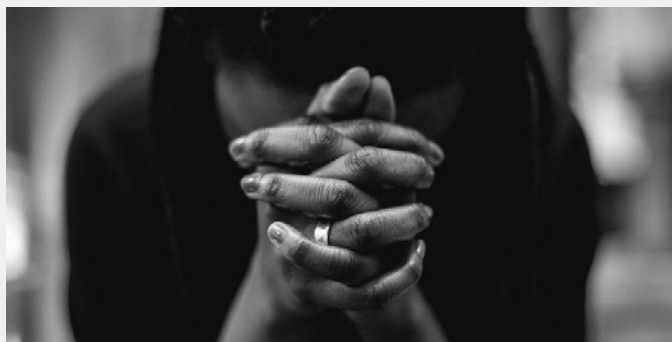
