This Sunday's Gospel Message

Suffering is one of the themes in today's gospel passage. It is the paradox

of our humanity that almost anything of value in our lives is also connected to our suffering for that treasure. Jesus makes this abundantly clear as he is explaining to the disciples what it means to follow him. Suffering is a non-negotiable part of true discipleship.

This is also true of every time of transition in our lives. Whether it is moving on to a new level of education or a new job or a new relationship -- even when we so deeply want to move forward -- letting go of what we have grown comfortable with involves suffering. Suffering is also a reminder that none of us is going to be around forever, nor will any of those whom we love be around forever. Knowing that our earthly existence is limited is both painful and simultaneously a source of profound appreciation for this life. Suffering is considered a great teacher in most cultures and religions. At the very least, we are reminded that no matter what we might (foolishly) think at certain moments or times in our lives, we are not really in charge. That awareness alone can be upsetting to us, causing its own unique pain.

Even though all that is true, because suffering is painful, we never seek it out. Instead, it is something we tolerate or even come to embrace when we know it is the price we must pay for a greater good, a greater love, a greater appreciation of God, of others, of ourselves. But it is never something we pursue itself. That would be unhealthy,

Maybe this is a good day to consider what it is you most value in your life and in your relationships. What price you have paid to ensure that it continues to be present in your life? Within that context, we see the value of suffering. Never desired, but for the valuable gifts it makes possible, always willingly endured for that higher good. The daily challenge is to try to make certain living the gospel is part of that dynamic in our life. Am I willing to suffer for the sake of what our Lord has asked us to do?

Last week, we welcomed another student-priest to the rectory. Fr. Pius Nwiyi joins us from Nigeria. He is studying counseling at Loyola and expects to be here for about two years. His introduction will be in next Sunday's newsletter/bulletin.


Gym Mass Returns Next Sunday, September 19

Angels Unaware

"Be welcoming to strangers, many have entertained angels unawares." ~ Hebrews 13:2

Perhaps you have seen the photos of a sculpture Pope Francis commissioned for the piazza outside St. Peter's in Rome. Entitled *Angels Unaware*, this sculpture depicts more than 140 immigrants from across history densely packed onto a boat with the Holy Family. The sculpture makes vivid Pope Francis' reminder to all believers that we are all sisters and brothers and come from a very long faith tradition of welcoming migrants and refugees to our society.

A second casting of this sculpture has been completed and is now on a national tour. It arrived at Loyola University's Lake Shore campus near the southwest corner of the West Quad last Friday and will be displayed until the end of September. A special Mass to commemorate this occasion will be held on Saturday, September 11 at 6:00 pm at the Madonna della Strada Chapel on Loyola's campus with Cardinal Blase J. Cupich presiding. Please note, all visitors to Loyola's campus must be vaccinated and wear masks while indoors.



Our Religious Ed Program: Classes Held In-Person on Sunday Mornings

Our 2021-2022 Religious Education Religious Ed classes will begin this month! The plan this school year is to have in-person instruction on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:15 am. The first day of class and a parent meeting is planned for Sunday, September 19 at 9:15 am in the Social Hall (1401 West Granville Avenue, the lower level). This school year, fees are \$200 for one child and \$225 for two or more children. An additional sacramental fee of \$60 is required for children making their First Communion, First Reconciliation, or Confirmation.

Two women in the parish were willing to be interviewed to help prepare her to be Confirmed. Mary Clare's job was to listen carefully as each told her why they were Catholics. In the eight years since Mary Clare was Confirmed, she has been a participant in the campus ministries at both Loyola Academy and Notre Dame University, where she is a senior, and many other social service programs. grandfather this way, my heart filled with joy.

NCA Junior Kindergarten: Spots Available

Is your child celebrating their 5th birthday after the September 1st cut-off date and, therefore, unable to attend Kindergarten this year? Are you saying to yourself, "He or she has already spent a year or two in preschool and could use a different challenge this year"?

Then check out our unique Junior Kindergarten (JK) program! NCA prides itself in answering that need we saw with some of our preschool families by developing our JK program* as part of our Early Learning Center. While JK is still aimed at building the foundation for Kindergarten attendance the following year, it does so in a unique and challenging way that is just right for those who will turn five between September 1st and February 15th this school year. It is a full-day, five-day-a-week class that offers children in this age range many opportunities to develop learning traits that they'll use throughout their school years, such as creativity, curiosity, mindfulness,

independence, decision-making, self-regulation, and experiencing positive social interactions.

Along with readiness for literacy and math, our JK program provides fun art, music, PE, yoga, Spanish, Religion, and technology activities.

Heart to Heart Ministry Monthly Update

Featured below is an update from our busy Heart to Heart Ministry and our very active Lending Closet:

The Lending Closet loans durable medical equipment such as shower chairs/stools; tub transfer benches; bedside commodes and toilet seat risers; knee scooters; rollators, wheelchairs, and transport chairs; walkers; canes; bed trays and "grabbers". These loans are free of charge and can be used for as long as they are needed.

August's Durable Medical Equipment Lending Closet saw activity from Edgewater to Alsip, as we are the only known free Lending Closet in the City of Chicago. Last month, we dispensed 33 pieces of equipment and six large boxes of incontinence supplies such as Depends and bed pads. We served individuals, medical institutions, and insurance companies from zip codes 60660, 60640, 60641, 60645, 60622, 60625, 60610, and 60601. Inquiries and requests were fielded from medical social workers, caseworkers, registered nurses, and other healthcare professionals (including a pediatric social worker from Journeycare Hospice). Thank you to the twelve individuals/families who donated equipment their loved ones no longer needed, as well as unopened incontinence products and/or other medical supplies such as a blood pressure cuff, an oximeter, etc.

The Center for Disability and Elder Law (CDEL) provides free legal services to low-income seniors and persons with disabilities. Attorneys from CDEL will host a workshop at St. Gertrude on Friday, September 17. They will assist participating parishioners with creating Powers of Attorney, Living Wills, and Wills. Interested in Becoming Catholic?First RCIA Meeting Set for Next Sunday, Sept. 19

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process by which adults learn more about the Catholic Church. RCIA will begin with an informational meeting on Sunday, September 19 in the Ministry Center after 10:30 am Masses.

Many people who begin RCIA are non-Catholics seeking to become Catholic or at least to explore whether Catholicism might be a good home. Those who complete the process and decide to become Catholic are initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. Others who take RCIA are already Catholic but want a deeper understanding of their faith foundation.

The RCIA process does not ask those who have been baptized in another

faith to give up their denominational experiences. Rather, the RCIA process seeks to add new colors and designs to their existing faith life tapestry. In addition to attending Mass, the RCIA process includes weekly gatherings of breaking open the Word of God, sharing our stories, and learning about our faith traditions.
