Celebrating The Feast of St. Gertrude

From Father Rich

Happy Feast Day! This weekend we celebrate our parish feast day of St. Gertrude. We welcome Bishop Bartosic who is the presider at the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass.

Each year on this feast day, we honor one parishioner who has shown by a tireless example of service to the community, that he or she carries within the spirit of St. Gertrude. I am very happy to announce that this year's Spirit of St. Gertrude Award recipient is Joe Donnelly! Joe has been a founder of the Refugee Committee, active in Helping Hands making sandwiches, a general helper at



funerals, including acting as our 'go-to' altar server, Eucharistic Minister, Minister of Care, Heart to Heart volunteer, and has provided service in a wide variety of ways and occasions to the parish community. Congratulations, Joe, on a great example for all of us! Thank you for your outstanding service!

I am, again this year, reflecting on St. Gertrude's image of the beating heart of Jesus which she experienced in her mystical visions. As we all know, you only hear another person's heartbeat when you place your head against their chest. That she heard the Lord's heartbeat indicates how closely she had come into contact with him; how closely Jesus had drawn her to himself. Each of us is invited into this same kind of intimacy with the Lord. The second part of this image that I found powerful was its great message of hope. In a vision in which St. John was present, Gertrude asked John if he, too, felt the beating of Jesus' Divine Heart on the night of the Last Supper. He told her he was saving this revelation for a time when the world needed it to rekindle its love. How might each of us rekindle Christ's love in the world?

As we celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at Mass this weekend, just a reminder that this sacrament is for anyone suffering from any serious illness or any chronic condition which limits their ability to live a full and vital life. This can be a physical, spiritual, mental, or emotional condition. In this sacrament, we are promised the healing grace of God's love, including the forgiveness of our sins. Each time we are anointed, all our sins are forgiven. Let us keep in our prayers all those who are ailing.

Members of the Parish Pastoral Council will be in the back of church after Mass today to gather input from parishioners about your experience with the weekend Mass schedule -- its convenience, different styles of music, etc. Please take a moment to speak to one of the Council members and fill out one of the short questionnaires. This is part of our year-long exploration of the schedule.

Today is also the World Day of the Poor. This is a great opportunity to search out ways to help people on their path **out** of poverty -- perhaps by a donation to a scholarship fund designed to help poor students, or doing some "homework" to investigate which items in your regular grocery cart can benefit the rise **from** poverty, which ones may be contributing to holding people **in** poverty, and adjusting regular shopping habits accordingly. Let us pray for changing hearts, for concern for our sisters and brothers throughout the world who survive every day on so much less than we can possibly imagine.

Next weekend, we will have a speaker on behalf of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD.) The annual collection also will be taken up next weekend after Communion. We welcome speakers from the Jane Addams Senior Caucus and parishioners Ed Jacobs and Mary Ann O'Connor. So much of what CCHD helps make possible is ministry "Working on the Margins." Please be generous to this very important work being accomplished by sharing our financial resources and our prayers.

We are St. Gertrude

We are a caring, compassionate faith community bringing the Gospel of the Lord into the world as we gather to worship God, serve others, are educated in our faith, and work for justice. Our ministries include:

- **Care for Real:** St. Gertrude helped start this food, clothing, and pet pantry, and our parish continues to actively support its mission to serve the Edgewater community.
- **Committee Against Domestic Violence:** This group works to raise awareness about this issue and participates in supply drives for area shelters.
- **Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers, Lectors, Altar Servers, Sacristans, Greeters, Counting Teams, and the Environment Committee:** Volunteers welcome people, read at Masses, distribute Communion, coordinate and count the collection, help prior to and during Mass, and decorate the Church.
- **Growing in Faith:** Parishioner-written reflections on the Sunday readings, their lives, or current events are shared in the weekly bulletin.
- **Gym Mass:** Music and short parishioner reflections after the homily engage participants in the celebration of our faith. Fellowship, coffee, and refreshments follow this 10:30 am Mass held in the Gym.
- **Heart to Heart:** Serving seniors in Edgewater, volunteers provide friendly visits, well-being phone calls, assistance with grocery shopping, and transportation to church, events, and medical appointments. Heart to Heart also oversees the Lending Closet of durable medical equipment.
- **Helping Hands Ministry:** Under the umbrella of the Heart to Heart ministry, volunteers provide their time and donations of food to make sandwiches for a local homeless shelter.
- **Kids Word:** During the 10:30 am Mass, children in kindergarten through fourth grade are invited to participate in age-appropriate activities, reflections, and lessons from the Bible.
- **Knitting Club:** This group knits prayers into blankets and gifts them to those suffering from illness, loss, or experiencing painful life events.
- **Music Ministry:** Saint Gertrude's incredible music adds praise through song to each Mass and help us strengthen our social bonds through concerts and programs.
- **Ministry of Care:** Coordinated by the Heart to Heart Ministry, the homebound of our parish receive a visit and are given Holy Communion.
- **Ministry of Praise:** Homebound parishioners unable to participate in parish life contribute their gift of prayer for the intentions of the parish.
- **NCA Green Team:** The group's goal is to provide opportunities to become more environmentally active and aware, using Pope Francis' *Laudato Si'* encyclical as a guidepost. The group also organizes area clean-ups.
- **Parish Advisory Groups:** Our Development Council, Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Committee, and Buildings and Grounds Committee help manage parish funds, our buildings, and plan for St. Gertrude's future.
- **Religious Education:** Children from grades 1-8 nourish and deepen their relationship with God through prayer and reflection, learn about being a disciple of Jesus, and what it means to be part of a community of faith.
- **R.C.I.A.:** The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults guide men and women interested in exploring the meaning and traditions of our faith and prepare them to become Catholic.
- **Sacramental Preparation for Children:** Sacramental prep programs are available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation.
- **St. Gertrude Presents:** This group organizes plays and our cabaret to fundraise for our parish.
- **St. Gertrude Refugee Ministry:** Working with Catholic Charities, this group sponsors newly-arrived refugees, providing both financial and emotional support as they settle into their new lives in Chicago.
- **United Power for Action and Justice.** The group is currently working on issues related to gun violence, health care, affordable housing, immigration, and violence prevention.
- **Women's Friendship Club:** This senior women's group meets monthly for socialization and parish activities.
- **Women's Club:** The mission of the club is to build community among women of all ages from the parish, have fun, and address parish needs.
- **WOW Youth Group:** Teens of the parish gather to hang out, talk about what's important to them, and do service projects, including mission trips.
- **Youth & Family Ministry:** We offer a number of programs that are focused on developing and nurturing a deep relationship with God and encourage children to appreciate what it means to be part of a welcoming, loving, diverse community.

Growing in Faith

Working toward the Kin-dom of God

We are in the “end times” of our liturgical year during which we hear bible passages that are “eschatological.” *The Catholic Study Bible* defines that 25-cent word as “**eschatological, eschatology** (Gk *eschata*, “last things”), a concern with the end time, or the end of the world as we know it, whether that involves a new historical era radically discontinuous from this one, or an entirely new cosmos after the destruction of the current one.” (1788)

In last week's Gospel passage from Luke, we heard reference to “the coming age.” (Lk 20:38) In this week's Gospel, Jesus foretells the destruction of the Second Temple in Jerusalem and warns of false prophets who will misinterpret natural and political disasters as signs of the end times. Next week, we celebrate the feast of Christ, King of the Universe, but the Gospel passage is of the end of Jesus's time on earth as he is crucified “King of the Jews.”

Pay attention, and you will discover that eschatological passages about the coming of the kingdom of God continue into the opening weeks of Advent. While we await that time when justice and peace will reign, we need to remember also that the kingdom of God erupts each time we choose to love and care for one another, each time we are peace makers and work for justice.

Theologian Ada Maria Isasi-Diaz calls this “the kin-dom of God,” when all of creation will know itself as kin. I am wondering...How might we all, through our individual and communal actions, work toward the coming of this “kin-dom”?

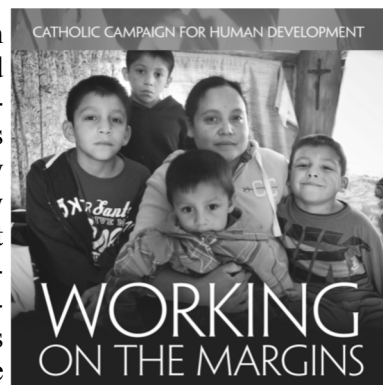

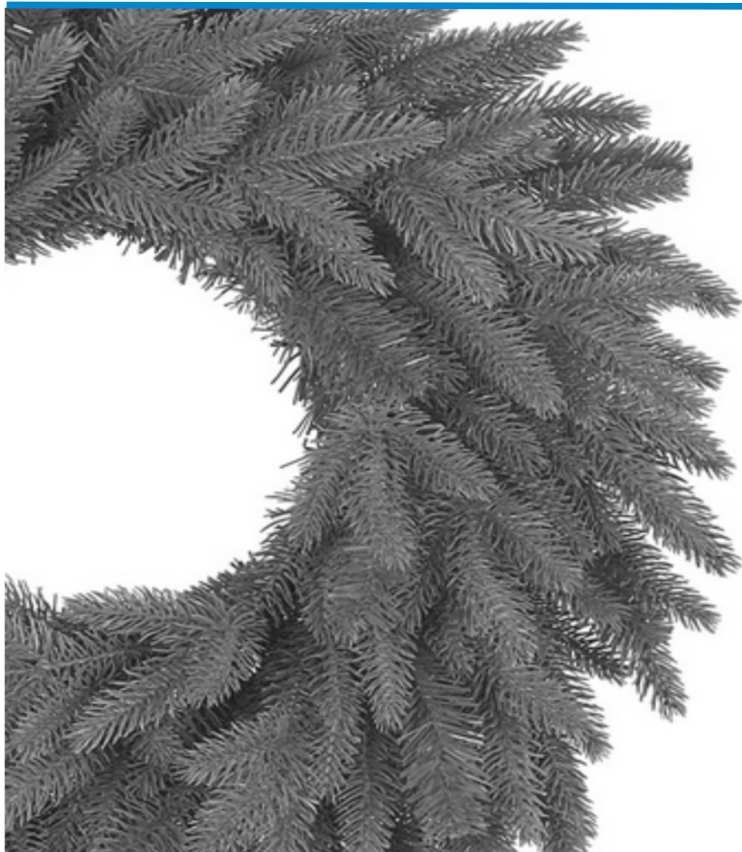
A limited number of trees, wreaths, and garland are available for sale, with proceeds benefiting St. Gertrude's ministries.

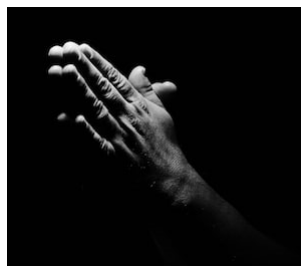

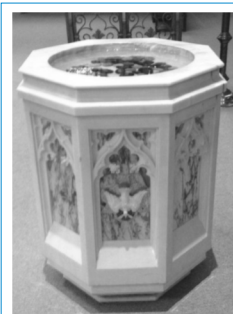
