Ride and Rally report: Jim Miller is still working on getting the final numbers. He will reach out to Corrie when he has those numbers.

Off Road / Maps Trail App for Check In: Corrie sent a message to Trails Offroad about partnering to build a resource that will help us track trail use across the state. William from Blue Ribbon is meeting with Trails Offroad soon, he will bring up our interest to them. It is very concerning that the BLM is ramping up and actively looking to close trails. We want to act with a sense of urgency getting this app built. Corrie will be reaching out to ONX and Gaya but is hopeful to hear back from Trails Offroad first.



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2024 Ride & Rally: Karleen and Ray from SIOR – They are going to acquire the tax id number from Corrie. They are also looking to create a web page resource, via the State Association website, that can be continually used each year for R & R details, resources plus tips and best practices. Corrie and Lisa will partner to create the page on the website. This resource will land on the public access portion of the page as we want all to see how much fun we have at the Ride & Rally.

Fundraisers: The Best of Idaho Off-roading 2023: Awards for different off roading categories. Whoops! (Heather), Carnage (Josh), Creative Trail Fix (Tammie), Belle of the Ball (Corrie), Best Flex (Klint). The submission with the most votes in each category wins that categories trophy. The submission with the most overall votes wins a 50/50 pot, 50% of the total amount accrued from votes. All submissions would need to include pictures and a backstory. It would be \$1.00 a vote to vote, no limit on voting. Online Voting opens on January 1st and closes March 1st, for those wanting to vote in cash/in person, in person voting will be open for the first 30 minutes of the annual meeting in March. Submissions are from the previous years off roading experiences. Winners are presented at State Association Annual meeting. We would compile submissions as they are presented and share them on the website. Reminders will be sent to all association club members that voting starts January 1st. Each board member will provide a trophy for their category. Trophy would need to fit into a 12x12x12 box. Trophy would need to be family friendly. Introduce trophies at the October meeting. Under 100 words for each submission.
