## **GUEST ARTIST: SIMONE STANLEY**



BMDT is excited to announce that our guest artist this year is Simone Stanley, who has been a supporter of our company for many years.

Equal parts creative and data-driven, Simone is a scholar as well as an innovative choreographer. She graduated Summa Cum Laude with a B.S. in Chemical Engineering from Howard University in 2017 and graduated with a Masters in Biotechnology from Georgetown University in 2019. Currently, Simone is a business development and marketing associate at PathSensors, is a biotechnology company applying a genetically engineered cell-based technology to detect biothreats and pathogens at previously unattainable levels of speed, sensitivity, and specificity.

Simone, a former member of I.AM.WE, Howard's first contemporary dance company, is a close friend of BMDT. She performed in past BMDT concerts and choreographed numerous pieces for the company. Her two latest pieces, "Thy Will" (Spring 2019) and "Balogun" (Spring 2020) have challenged company in very different styles, while educating them on their roots. Dancers have continuously expressed their praise and appreciation for Simone's work, and it is an honor to have her back with the company. We are incredibly lucky to have Simone as our resident guest artist; she already hosted our first Community Class and held an asynchronous class. This semester she's presenting her virtual Living Room Series with BMDT.
