



1. Fig Leaf Expansion

- 3. I (Rev. Jonathan Lamb), will never personally email or text you one-on-one to ask for help with the discretionary fund of the churches.
 If you feel led to give to your church's discretionary fund, you can write a check noting "discretionary fund" and place it in the offering plate.
 Any request to assist with "discretionary funds" will be made from the pulpit and/or newsletter.
