Please note that we are not always close to a phone or computer when teaching so you may not get an immediate answer. If you have not heard back from us in twenty-four hours try again!

Please note:

All rehearsals and performances are NOT optional and are part of each student's grade for the nine weeks. Please check the attendance policy in the handbook regarding absences for each ensemble.

This calendar does not include all rehearsal dates and times. These will be added to the calendar as the school year progresses. The calendar is subject to change. Changes made to the calendar will be made at least two weeks prior to any event.

Elementary General Music

All students in grades K-5 will have a general music class twice a week for 50 minutes. Students will learn the fundamentals of music, play classroom instruments, sing, move with music, develop listening skills, vocabulary, and

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music history knowledge. The curriculum taught is approved by the Hillsborough County Public Schools and is in line with the Florida Education Standards. All students will participate in district testing for music at the end of the school year.

Performance is an important part of learning music! All our K-5 students will have the opportunity to perform in at least one concert during the year! Our students in Kindergarten, Grade 2, and Grade 4 will perform in the December Dazzle Concert. Students in grades 1, 3, and 5 will perform in the Spring Fling Concert. Dates of these concerts can be found in the calendar. A memo with more information about the concert will be published about one month prior to the event.

Elementary Ensembles

Elementary Chorus

Elementary Chorus is open to all students in grades 2-5 without an audition. Students participating are expected to participate for the entire year. Students in chorus will perform in multiple events throughout the year. Rehearsal attendance and best behavior is required for this ensemble. More information about elementary chorus can be found in the sign-up contract at the beginning of the year. Students in the chorus will need to purchase the chorus shirt, to be worn for all performances with black bottoms (skirt, pants, or shorts) and black closed toe shoes. No heels please!

World Percussion

This ensemble is open to students in grades 4/5 by audition only. This ensemble will include both world drums and xylophones, along with other creative aspects of performance! Students will have the chance to develop and grow their knowledge in musical theory, drumming, xylophone, and other percussion-based instruments (both pitched and unpitched). All students will have opportunities to learn all instruments utilized in the ensemble based on need within with current repertoire. More information about this ensemble and auditions can be found in the student sign up packet. Students in the chorus will need to purchase the chorus shirt, worn for all performances with black bottoms (pants, or shorts) and black closed-toe shoes. No heels please!

Show Choir

Show Choir is open to students in grades 4-6 by audition only. Students involved in Show Choir must also be in Chorus (unless in 6th Grade). This group combines singing and dancing techniques to put on show type performances. Rehearsal attendance and best behavior is required for this ensemble. More information about Show Choir can be found in the sign-up contract at the beginning of the year. Students will be assigned a uniform (dress or pants suit) to wear. There will be a \$15 rental fee for uniforms. Students will need black jazz or flat shoes. Girls should have black bicycle shorts (that should not come lower than the dress). Flesh tone tights or nylons are encouraged but not required. Boys will need black socks.

Middle School Course Descriptions

Sixth Grade Band

Sixth grade band is a 1/2 year course taking place in second semester from January to May. Students complete the required wheel curriculum in the first semester and then may choose to continue with band as their elective course. Students enrolled in sixth grade band will be assigned an instrument and learn fundamental music techniques as well

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as build upon their foundations of music literacy. Previous musical training and music reading is of course helpful, but not necessary. Students may have before or after school rehearsals when necessary for concert preparation for which attendance is mandatory. Scheduled performances are required as part of the class. *Home practice and video assessments are required as part of the grading of this class. See the grading section for more information. Private lessons are helpful and encouraged but not required.*

Beginner/Intermediate/Advanced Band

Beginner Band is a full year class and is open to students who have little or no experience playing a band instrument.

Intermediate Band is a full year group that is open to students with previous band experience. Students will continue to work on instrumental techniques and music literacy.

Advanced Band is a full year group that is open to students with previous band experience. This ensemble will be selected by audition. Mandatory MPA participation is part of this class.

Each band performs several concerts each year. *Private lessons are highly recommended.* Private teachers can help with preparation of All-County Band auditions, All-State Band auditions, and preparation of band music. Students may have before or after school rehearsals when necessary for concert preparation. At least two weeks' advance notice will be given, and attendance is mandatory. Scheduled performances are required as part of the class. *Home practice and video assessments are required as part of the grading of this class. See the grading section for more information.*

Orchestra

Orchestra is a full year course open to all students. Orchestra students will learn fundamental music techniques as well as build upon their foundations of music literacy. Previous musical training and music reading is of course helpful, but not necessary. Students may have before or after school rehearsals when necessary for concert preparation for which attendance is mandatory. Scheduled performances, including participation in MPA assessments are required as part of the class. *Home practice and video assessments are required as part of the grading of this class. See the grading section for more information. Private lessons are helpful and encouraged but not required.*

Middle School Chorus

Chorus is a full year course open to all students. Choir students will learn fundamental music and health singing techniques as well as build upon their foundations of music literacy. Previous musical training and music reading is of course helpful, but not necessary. Students may have before or after school rehearsals when necessary for concert preparation for which attendance is mandatory. Scheduled performances, including participation in MPA assessments are required as part of the class. *Home practice and video assessments are required as part of the grading of this class. See the grading section for more information. Private lessons are helpful and encouraged but not required.*

Jazz Band

Jazz Band is an after-school ensemble, open by audition only. Audition times and dates will be posted in the music room.

Code of Conduct for Ensembles at Rampello

All ensemble students are responsible for the reading of and adhering to the HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT. In addition, the following behavior policies will be in effect in the music rooms and when representing Rampello at events off campus:

FOLLOW DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY.

To create a safe environment for our students and music equipment, it is important that students listen to and

follow directions the first time. Students not following directions may be asked to leave the event or ensemble.

BE PREPARED.

Learning cannot take place if one does not have the proper equipment or if one has not practiced his or her part.

RESPECT OTHER PEOPLES' AND THE SCHOOL'S PROPERTY

Musical instruments are sensitive and fine-tuned machines. They should only be handled, touched, and/or played by the owner. Sharing of instruments is not allowed. Students will be held accountable for any damages that may occur from not following school and district policies or procedures.

FOLLOW THE GOLDEN RULE

Students will be respectful within the music classrooms, within ensembles, and at all extra-curricular events. Students not showing respect may be removed from ensembles.

GUM, CANDY, FOOD, AND/OR DRINKS ARE NOT ALLOWED.

These things can damage the working mechanisms inside instruments and equipment and are a choking hazard for singers. Water in a closed bottle is allowed, and students will be given opportunities for water breaks during rehearsals.

DEVICES ARE NOT PERMITTED DURING CLASSES, REHEARSALS, OR PERFORMANCES.

Students may ask the teacher if they need to contact home but should wait for a break in instruction to do so. Teachers will be following school policy of "if we see it, we take it."

Music teachers work with unusually large classes. To maintain high educational and musical standards, a high standard of conduct must be maintained. Parents and students invest a great deal of time, money, and love into the music program to make this an organization in which to be proud. Therefore:

Membership in the Rampello Music Program is contingent upon adherence to the rules and procedures outlined in this handbook.

Any student who challenges these rules and procedures will be removed from the program.

Classroom Etiquette

Students are expected to exhibit the following qualities on a consistent daily basis, including concerts:

Effort: proper posture, active listening, sincere attempt to demonstrate mastery.

Responsibility: turns in items on time, a positive contributor to classroom environment.

Attitude: pleasant demeanor, receptive to instruction, falls in line with class activities, meets expectations.

Concert Etiquette

Our concerts are always a lot of fun and represent the fine efforts of our students during the preparation process. Concert Etiquette should be followed for the enjoyment of all audience members and respect for the performers. Please review concert etiquette for both performer and audience with your student and family. The purpose of these concerts is to showcase the students' musical achievements, *not* to draw attention to performer or audience behavior.

Performer Etiquette:

- Do not talk or play out of turn.
- Do not stand, wave, or draw attention to yourself.
- Keep an eye on the conductor to get instructions.
- Follow directions from stage managers and conductors.

Audience Etiquette:

- When the lights go down, quickly get quiet.
- Silence any cell phones, pagers, etc.
- Do not enter or leave the Auditorium when the ensemble is playing; wait until the selection is over.
- Applaud for everyone, after every song – each group has worked equally hard.
- When you applaud, do not make unnecessarily loud noises.
- Please be courteous when taking pictures and video. Flashes can be distracting to the performers on stage.
- Families with small children should sit near an exit so you can easily slip out if they get restless.
- Stay for the entire concert, every performer has worked hard and deserves a full audience.

Performance/Field Trip Policies

A student's participation in a music field trip or performance is contingent upon that student meeting criteria established by Rampello K-8 and Hillsborough Public School as well as the director. Some of the criteria may include:

- Minimum GPA requirements
- Fulfilling all fundraising responsibilities, payment of all school fees/school instrument rental fees
- Demonstration of acceptable behavior (i.e., not receiving referrals, detentions, tardies, etc.)
- Past concert or class participation
- Class assignments completed.
- Turning in of requested materials, permission slips, equipment, or uniforms
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***Students music turn in required permission slips by the due date, or risk not attending the event.**

Students will be given a reasonable chance to fulfill these requirements in the time preceding each event. If the event is for Middle School and a student does not qualify for a particular event, his/her grade for that event will be determined by the completion of an alternative assignment, to be determined by the director.

Before/After School/Pick up/drop off information

Unless otherwise noted, all students must be picked up and dropped off for all events in the car line area. This is for the safety of your children. Students should be picked up within ten minutes of the end of the event or rehearsal. Students who are not picked up in a timely manner may face removal from the ensemble.

Students will not be allowed to stay at the school between school ending and concert time unless they are registered with HOST.

Students in morning HOST that are signed up for elementary chorus will be released at 7AM and are to go straight to the music room.

Students involved in afternoon HOST must be signed out by an adult before attending concerts.

Elementary Grading Policy

Elementary General Music is designed to give a broad overview of music to students. All students in grades K-5 have music twice a week for fifty minutes. Students will learn classroom instruments, singing, move to music, study rhythm, performance skills, and learn music vocabulary that aligns with the Florida State and National Standards.

Updated 3/8/24

Grading in music places a strong emphasis on active participation, effort, and mastery of the Florida State Standards. Students struggling academically in music will receive a progress alert at the end of the first five weeks of the quarter.

Students in music are expected to follow all Hillsborough County and Rampello School Rules. In our classroom, students are expected to practice respect for each other, the equipment, and to always show their best effort. Students not meeting behavior expectations will first receive an in-class warning, followed by a note home (please check student planners). In the case of a more serious infraction, a conduct cut will be given. Three or more notes/conduct cuts in a quarter will result in a behavior mark on the report card. A progress report will be sent home after the second note or conduct cut.

Middle School Grading Policy

It is important to remember that band, chorus, and orchestra are a “real” class and a full year commitment. Students will earn a grade for their class, and the grade counts toward the honor roll. The following is a breakdown of how each student will be graded in Middle School Ensembles:

- **Daily Participation/Professionalism/Preparedness* 40%**
- **Concert/Performance/Quizzes/Exams 30%**
- **Playing/Written/Video Assignments 30%**

*Daily & Concert Participation: Students receive points toward this grade daily by *participating positively* in classroom activities. This includes having the materials necessary to participate in class (i.e.: instrument, accessories, music binder, music book, etc.) Each day’s participation is worth 5 points for a weekly participation grade of 25 points.

**An unexcused absence from Music Performance Assessments in March or April, or other performances will require a makeup assignment.*

**Students will not be allowed to perform at concerts or MPAs without proper attire. This will negatively impact their performance grade.*

Class assignments, concert and rehearsal dates will be posted on the Canvas, Remind, and Music Website for your convenience.

Video Assignments

Each student will be required to play lines from their method books and concert music during each nine-week period for a grade. These assignments will be turned in via Canvas. Students will need access to a smart phone, computer, or tablet with a microphone at their home. Computers will also be available before and after school for students without internet access available.

Rampello Middle School requires semester exams and final exams for all classes.

Attendance

Students are expected to attend their rehearsals and concerts. Music is a co-curricular class which means sometimes there will be required events before and after school. Performing groups can only develop to their fullest potential when each member is fulfilling their role completely. Absences not only affect the learning of one student, who misses the summative assessment, but also the learning of the other ensemble members. Concert dates and times are published in this handbook, on the Website, and on Remind.

How to handle conflicts:

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Students should be encouraged to participate in a variety of activities at this age, and sometimes conflicts will occur. Use the following guidelines to resolve any conflicts:

1. Copy the Music Calendar (included in this handbook) into your family calendar.
2. Notify the director of any school conflicts, so that the director may make arrangements with the sponsor.

EXCUSED ABSENCES

Everyone experiences things in life that call for an absence from an event. Provided an absence note is on file with the director within two (2) days of the absence, these absences may be made up. CONCERTS can be made up as seen below in the “Concert/Performance Make-up Policy” section of this handbook.

Below are some common reasons for granting an **EXCUSED** absence:

- *Illness, family emergency, planned family trip*

An “excused absence” will remain a zero in the grade book until the completion of a makeup assignment by the student.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

Below are some examples of excuses generally regarded as **UNEXCUSED**:

Sporting Events (practices or games, Social Engagements, “I couldn’t find a ride,” “I forgot to tell my parents,” “I couldn’t find my band uniform,” “My reed broke.”)

An “unexcused absence” will remain a zero in the grade book until the completion of a makeup assignment by the student. An excess of unexcused absences may result in the student being removed from the ensemble at the end of the semester.

Concert/Performance Make-Up Policy

Missing a concert is the same as missing an exam or summary project in another class, and therefore requires a make-up project. Make-ups will be graded based on the quality of the project. It is up to the student to schedule a time before or after school with the director within 2 days of missing the assignment.

Music Performance Assessment

Members of Middle School Ensembles will be selected based on positive participation and dedication to perform in the *District MPA*. These performances will be evaluated by three highly qualified judges and rated on a musical scale including Superior, Excellent, Good, Fair and Poor. After their concert appearance, each band will then go to another room and be evaluated on their ability to sight-read music they have never seen before. Here, a fourth judge will evaluate them using the same scale.

Uniforms:

All students in music ensembles are required to wear the designated concert uniform. Uniforms will be worn at all events at which the ensemble performs at, including but not limited to all school performances as well as evaluated performances.

ALL students should maintain his/her uniform in like new condition at all times.

*Please see the end of the handbook for a supplement outlining other required materials.

Concert Dress

All musicians are required to be in the proper ensemble uniform for ALL performances. Any students not wearing the regulated uniform at the time of the performance will NOT be permitted to participate in that performance and will thus not receive a grade for the performance.

The following is a list of the required Concert Dress for each ensemble:

Middle School (All):

Rampello Music Polo (available for purchase online- see the website for the link). Black pants or long skirt, black shoes, black socks or tights. No open toe shoes.

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Elementary Choruses:

Chorus tee-shirt (available online through website), black pants, black shoes, black socks. No high heels.

Show Choir 4-6:

Show choir dress (available to rent), flesh colored tights, black shoes, (no heels) black bicycle shorts under dress. Boys: White dress shirt, black pants, -bow tie and suspenders will be provided. Black shoes, black socks.

World Percussion: Ensemble tee-shirt (available online through website), nice pants (dark), black shoes, black socks. No high heels.

*Rental/purchase information will be provided within the first month of the school year/semester when your child joins.

The following items are **NOT PERMITTED** as concert dress:

T-shirts, tank tops, shorts, Capri pants, sweat/athletic pants, cargo pants, leather, suede, JEANS, LEGGINGS, sneakers, excessive make-up, excessive perfume or cologne, excessive jewelry, bright nail polish, unusual colored hair (for evaluated performances). If you are not sure, ask!

The Director will provide the first copy of the music. Any copies made after will be the student's responsibility to print.

It will be the responsibility of the student to pay for the replacement of any lost or damaged books.

Instrument Rental (Middle School)

**Students will be responsible for obtaining an instrument by renting from the school, Music and Arts, or buying a personal instrument. They are also responsible for the necessary accessories for these instruments, including mouthpieces if possible. The band does not provide reeds, drumsticks, mallets, or practice pads.*

- Rental forms for school instruments will be passed out during class when instruments have been assigned.
- Instruments will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis, pending completion of the Instrument Rental.
- Instrument Rental for 1 school year is \$43.00. This can be paid through my payments plus.
- 6th Grade Band Rental Fee will be \$21.50 due by 1/30

****If a student is unable to afford the necessary supplies for class for any reason please reach out and we will work together to find a solution that best suits the situation***

Misuse of Musical Instruments

Musical instruments are vital educational tools that enhance learning, creativity, and the development of fine motor skills. They are also often significant investments for educational institutions. Misuse of these instruments not only diminishes their lifespan but also affects the quality of music education that a school can provide. It is crucial for students to understand what constitutes misuse to prevent damage and ensure the longevity and availability of these resources for all learners.

Misuse of musical instruments can take various forms, ranging from neglect, improper handling, to using them in ways they were not intended. Neglect involves failing to clean or maintain the instrument regularly, which can lead to the accumulation of dirt, grime, and mold, affecting its performance, hygiene, and potentially posing health risks. Improper handling includes dropping, throwing, or applying excessive force to the instrument, which can cause physical damage like dents, cracks, or broken components. Moreover, using instruments in ways they were not designed for, such as hitting a drum with objects other than drumsticks or using a string instrument as a percussion tool, can severely damage the instrument and compromise its functionality.

To prevent misuse, students are encouraged to follow best practices for instrument care and handling. These include storing instruments in their cases when not in use, using them in appropriate environments free from extreme temperatures and humidity, and avoiding the consumption of food and beverages near the instruments. Additionally, students should receive proper instruction on how to use and maintain their instruments and should report any damage or concerns to their music teacher immediately. By respecting these guidelines, students contribute to a positive learning environment and help ensure that musical instruments remain in good condition for future musicians. It is important to note that repair and replacement costs resulting from misuse are typically the responsibility of the parent or guardian. This policy underscores the importance of treating school-owned instruments with the same care and respect as personal property.

FAQ
