Exodus 12:21-31 A Lamb for Captive Israel 2nd Wed. in Lent Mar. 1, 2023 @ Immanuel, Mercedes

INTRO: 16th century Dutch ought independence from Spanish who controlled Rotterdam; soldiers house-to-house killing Dutch and dragging corpses into street. One house heard them coming; residents hiding, killed goat, swept blood under door w/broom. Soldiers saw it. "This one's already done," and moved on, saving people inside. Goat died; its blood saved the people.

I. BLOOD EVOKES FEELINGS

- A. Adverse feelings, sometimes
 - 1. some people faint at the sight, especially one's own blood
 - 2. many dislike bloody movies; surgery on TV; Elizabeth in Mayo Clinic O.R.
- B. But sometimes, also evoking good feelings
 - 1. as with goat's blood mentioned above at Rotterdam
- 2. or blood transfusion after surgery or accident
- C. For some, blood evokes feelings about eternal life
 - 1. 1 John 1:7...blood of Jesus Christ, His Son, cleanses us from all sin
- 2. that cleansing blood of Jesus, shed on Calvary for the whole world
- 3. Luther: for where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation
- 4. Jesus celebrated a ceremony about blood; instituted another, replacement
- 5. reaching way back in Israel's history

II. THE EGYPT EXODUS INVOLVED A LAMB'S SHED BLOOD

- A. 1500 years before Jesus; Jacob' descendants, Joseph's providence
 - 1. evil Egyptian masters sought to work Israelites to death; long before 1619
 - 2. killed male babies (Moses in reeds)(we kill before, they killed after birth)
 - 3.people cried to God; He called Moses via burning bush on Sinai
- B. God used Moses and Aaron to speak to Pharaoh
 - 1. first merely asking; Aaron's staff/snake, swallowed; heart grew hard; no deal
- 2. bloody river plague; Pharaoh OK's departure; plague removed, he reneges

- 3. repeated nine times; how stubborn can one man be! (excursus: plagues 1-5 Pharaoh hardened his heart; plagues 6-10 **God** hardened Pharaoh's heart; cp. Rom. 1:26 ...God gave them up to...")
- 4. Moses warns, last chance; see me no more; firstborn of man/beast be killed
- D. God provide a means to save anyone who will obey Him
- 1. God promises to pass over marked doorways
- 2. on 10th day of month Nisan, set aside a spotless, perfect lamb
- 3. kill lamb, blood on posts and lintel of door with hyssop branch
- 4. angel of death passed over blood-marked doors; killed firstborn in others
- 5. prompting Pharaoh and Egyptians to say 'get out of our country'
- 6. perfect lamb died as **substitute** so first-born could live (1st-born sermon...)
- 7. God commands Passover to be annual remembrance of His saving act

III. SHEDDING OF BLOOD WAS COMPLETED BY CHRIST JESUS

- A. At Jerusalem in an Upper Room, Jesus kept Passover
 - 1. fulfilling Old Testament laws; remember His ancestors' deliverance
 - 2. Lamb of God perfectly obeyed His Father; whole law fulfilled
 - 3. in anticipation of shedding His own blood on the next day
 - 4. His blood on a 'post' and 'lintel' of a cross

B. Asking us to remember

- 1. Passover lambs pointed to Christ, per John Baptist
- 2. now that Christ has come, no more need for Passover lambs
- 3. Lamb of God shed blood to save others; no more substitute lambs
- 4. a **new** covenant: Drink...My blood of the new covenant shed for you, for the forgiveness of sins
- 5. do this in remembrance of **Me** (substitutes Lord's Supper for Passover)
- C. We need to be rescued, saved, as surely as enslaved Israel
- 1. we show more in common with Pharaoh than with Jesus
- 2. also, like Israel, we turn to God **only** when we're desperate
- 3. and like Egyptians, more inclined to take advantage, than to help others
- 4. if not oppressing others, at least speaking ill of them

- 5. quite unmoved by suffering and oppressions around us
- 6. placing our desires and goals above God's will
- 7. deserving death and drowning in the Red Sea, just like Pharaoh
- D. But we ae saved; we are God's 'Israel'
- 1. because one Lamb of God was slain as our Substitute; once for all
- 2. no more sacrifice for sin; it is finished
- 3. Father sees blood of His Son Jesus over our 'doors'
- 4. evil angel of eternal death must pass over us
- 5. we are marked with the blood of Christ, our Substitute

CONCLUSION: In 1927, a blood specimen was taken by Adrian Stokes from a West African man named Asibi who was sick with yellow fever; it was made into a culture, then a vaccine for yellow fever. All yellow fever since 1927 is derived from this one man, multiplied over and over in labs. Millions are now saved from yellow fever by a blood sample from one man, Asibi. How much more does the blood of One Man, True God, afford **eternal** salvation for the whole world. As you apply the blood of Christ to yourself by trusting His promises, you have eternal life. Amen.
