

# **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

## WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO?

• Obtain **RANDOM** scale samples from all species on both **KEPT** and **RELEASED** fish throughout the season (May-October).

## WHEN?

- Fish may be caught and sampled at anytime during the month.
- Sample every 3<sup>rd</sup> fish you catch kept or released for that fishing trip.
- If you do not use all of the scale packets I give you, I will still gladly accept the information you have collected. Please just do the best you can.

#### WHERE?

• For this study, fish may be caught anywhere in Massachusetts waters, and may be caught from shore or by boat.

## WHICH FISH OR WHAT SIZES OF FISH?

- All sizes of fish are important to us! We need information on all fish **BIG** or **LITTLE**, **KEPT** or **RELEASED** to improve conservation and management. Please avoid collecting scales from just the largest fish you catch.
- Take scale samples only when you feel comfortable doing it, and please call or email me if you have questions or difficulties.
- If a fish appears stressed, sick, or injured, do not remove scales.
- Don't forget random samples from all sizes!
- Finally, as a reminder, all participants must adhere to state regulations for each fish species. For example; striped bass less than 28 inches must be released after scale samples are removed.
