INTRODUCTION

SOME DEFINITIONS



Sin according to the Royal Spanish Academy: Voluntary transgression of religious precepts, deviating from what is just, or failing to achieve the goal.



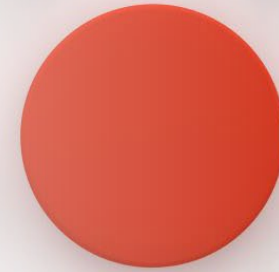
Sin in the Bible: Represented as offense, guilt, perversity, error, transgression, or weakness.



Greek Concept: Derived from "hamartia", which means missing the target, indicating a failure to reach the goal.

THE ORIGIN OF SIN

- Sin originates in human choice, not in God, who is just and righteous and hates sin.
- The fall of Satan preceded the fall of humanity, demonstrating the presence of sin in the spiritual realm before the creation of humanity.
- Satan, initially an angel named Lucifer or Lucifer, rebelled against God and was cast out of heaven, along with other angels who followed him, leading to his dedicated efforts to influence humanity away from God.





CONSEQUENCES OF SIN

- Adam and Eve disobeyed God after being tempted by Satan, introducing sin to the Earth.
- Sin produced drastic changes in them, including awareness of their nakedness, fear of God, and loss of the divine image.
- Adam and Eve's relationship with God was affected, resulting in their expulsion from Paradise and a spiritual separation.
