GUARDS STAGE EXTRAVAGANZA

At a most impressive Change in Command ceremony, Lt Col Richard L. Pascoe relinquished command of the 107th Engr Bn to Maj Donald R. Small who becomes the 9th commander of the 107th and counterpart units since its establishment in Aug., 1881. The afternoon military review of 650 guardsmen from 6 Upper Peninsula 107th units was followed by an evening program of cocktail hour, dinner program and military ball at which Colonel Pascoe was the honored guest. The wonderfully planned & extremely well executed maneuver from beginning to end was headed up by co-chairmen Capt Philip L. White, Bn S-3, and SFC Charles E. Nault, Bn Sgt Major. It was indeed a shining example of yet another 107th combined effort that certainly was a first-class job well deserving of praises and complimentary remarks lavishly expressed by numerous participants - including members of Dick's family, friends, associates and many notable military, political and community dignitaries. The ceremony, both for purpose and execution, will be documented in 107 history as one of its finest accomplishments. A jolly good show!

8th CO OF 107 RETIRES

How to do justice to one helluva fine ex-Battalion CO upon his retirement from the military? Without frills we state simply that Col Pascoe's 29 years of military service began way back in 1942 when he enlisted for Army duty. Infantry OCS at Ft. Benning preceded overseas duty in the Pacific Theater and his release from active duty in May '46 as a 1st Lt. His 22 years as a member of the 107th commenced in 1949 and included command and staff assignments each one a step forward towards assumption of command on 6-1-69 & promotion to Lt Col shortly thereafter. Our Association presentation, one of many such tributes made to Col Pascoe during the dinner program, speaks for itself - simply but most sincerely. The Marquette County Road

Commission will now have full benefit of Dick's leadership and engineering know-how in his capacity as Assistant Superintendent, Maintenance. 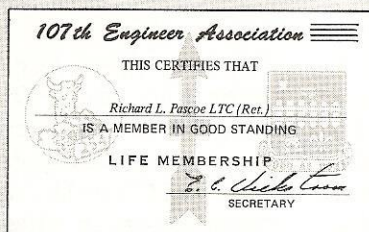

FINAL RETIREMENT OF EX-BN CO

William F. Milford, Jr., a prominent figure in the annals of 107 history, died on May 25, '71, at age 59. He was one of the special group whose service in the 107th spanned both sides of WWII- from 1936 to 1951 - from company commander to battalion commander. Bill was a lifelong resident of Calumet, Mich., a graduate civil engineer, and was engaged in the building supply and contracting business until ill health forced him to retire in 1966. Immediately after WWII, he was instrumental in reorganizing the 107th Engr Bn, Mich NG's and subsequently served as Bn CO until his retirement in 1951 with the rank of Lt Colonel. An enthusiastic registrant at the first 107 reunion in Marquette, his enthusiasm and organizational ability were recognized by virtue of his election to the Association's charter Bd. of Directors in which he served well & faithfully. The memory of this outstanding officer has been and will be perpetuated by means of the William F. Milford Trophy which is awarded annually to the best engineer soldier of the 107th NG Bn. Neither will he be forgotten in the hearts of the great many who served with him - in war and peace.

Duquette (Co B 254); plus Directors, Lt Col Richard L. Pascoe (Ret.); Rans J. Blondo (107-112), Clyde C. Asplund (Co A 254), Harvey J. Turcotte (Co B WWI), Lynn R. McDonald (107-522) and Past Presidents, Capt Henry P. Ilenich (CO Co A NG) and Maj Donald R. Small (Bn CO).

For the first time since 1964 the listing of officials fails to include the name of Francis D. Morin (Co C 254) as treasurer - only because Frannie asked to be relieved of the job come nomination/election time at the reunion just past. Our Awards Board is wondering if we should authorize Fran a Snortin' Bull Meritorious Medallion (well cured) for dedicated service or the Snortin' Bull Purple Heart for aches, pains and worries endured - both well earned and merited after 7 good and faithful years at our financial helm.

PRE-WWI VETS CHECK IN FOR REUNION

Two particularly noteworthy registrants at Calumet were the oldest vets of present day Association record - both born in 1889 and but eight years younger than the 107th's own 90 years. Charles G. Hoehner (Co A WWI) - a familiar face having logged 6 reunions already. His service began in 1913 with Co A, Corps of Engrs, Mich. NG's which served on the Mexican Border during the winter and spring of 1916-17 at Camp Bliss, Texas. Co A, including Charlie, later joined the 107th Engr Regt which was formed at Camp MacArthur, Texas on or about 9-18-17 for well documented WWI service. We recommend Charlie as a most interesting personality - one easily mistaken for a WWII vet when you seek him out come future reunions....Joseph Grahek, Calumet is an absolute newcomer to Association record having been reported in just last June by his son-in-law, John R. Ryan (Co A NG's). His is an enlistment dating all the way back to 3-18-06 and Co D 34th Mich Volunteer Infantry - previously designated Co D, Fifth Inf which outfit in turn goes directly back to the Calumet Light Guard - the very fountainhead of 107th lineage. Mr. Grahek was still with Co D 34th Inf when it was redesignated Co A, Corps of Engrs, Mich NG on 6-1-06. Although uncertain if his WWI service was with the 107th, we do know that he was a member of the 310th Engrs, 85th Division, in Northern Russia 1918-19. It was indeed appropriate having these two fine gentlemen at our 90th anniversary celebration.

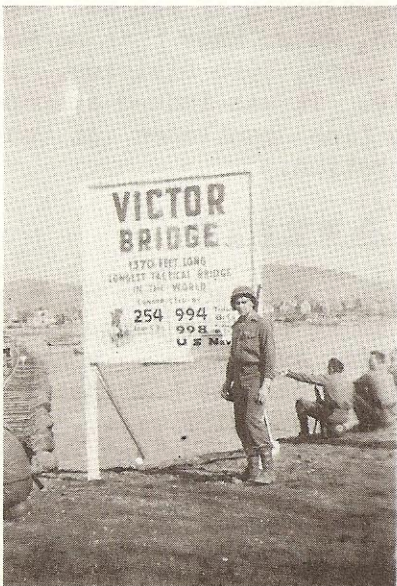
S H O R T S N O R T S
