MAJOR KOHN WINDS UP LONG MILITARY CAREER

Another of the old WWII era gang who went on to distinguish himself in postwar service in the 107th NG Bn, has wrapped up a long military career dating back to 1937. This time recognition goes to Major Edwin K. Kohn who hails from Calumet, Mich. - and we can't help but comment that Ed has carried a life membership in the Association since '63. High School ROTC began it all - and the morning report recorded him as Pvt Kohn when Co A 107th (Calumet) was Federally recognized early in 1937. Ed entered active duty on 15 Oct 40 with Co F when the entire 32nd Div, including the 107th, was called for that well remembered "one years'" tour of Federal service in the red clay, chigger-wood tick infested military reservations of Louisiana. During most of that year Ed was assigned as Sgt Major of the 2nd Bn commanded by Major Robert Adams. His transfer to Co D 127th Inf on 1-1-42 was a result of being caught home on leave when the 107th was hastily alerted and ordered to Fort Dix, N.J. (triggered by Pearl Harbor) to prepare

for movement to Belfast, Northern Ireland. Ed served with the 127th from then on - Stateside at Fort Devon, Mass. and Fort Ord, Cal. and overseas in the South-West Pacific Theatre with the 32nd (Australia, New Guinea, Philippines and Japan). He was awarded a battlefield commission as 2nd Lt Inf early in 1942 and finally released from service in March 1946. Not for long, however, because the old outfit, Co A 107th, was reorganized and Ed assumed its command and carried on as Co Comdr for a record 14 years. Later assignments in the 107th included posts as Asst Div Engr and Bn Exec Off. In May 1967 he was reassigned to 46th Div Hq as Asst G-2 and was eventually discharged from the Reserve on 14 Feb 68. Ed was honored at a dinner party this past January attended by his ex-associates of Bn command and staff. A BULL SHEET well done with best wishes to Comrade Ed.

Ray reminded us he was captured during the Bulge at BULLINGEN, BELGIUM, and finished out the war in Stalag 13C near HAMMELBERG, GERMANY. He is most anxious to get a print of the 3rd Platoon Co C 254 picture and will have a reproduction made for himself if he can get an original - unless someone has an extra to give him. Officer of Hq 107th NGs. Len was one of the main organizers of the very first reunion back in '61 and has been an enthusiastic, willing and able supporter of the cause ever since. He is responsible for researching and developing a wealth of historical data which he has made available to the BS staff. Len is a walking encyclopedia about the 107th - stand him to a round of cold ones and find out.....a recent, initial response from Merritt "Lipper" Leaf (H&S 254) is traceable to a WWI faithful, John P. Rule (Co B), who sent in the "Lips" address after being listed as one of the "missing" in the BS. John hails from Iron Mtn., Mich. and has "sounded off" at the last four reunions. "Lipper" promptly responded (with dues, natch) including this note: "Took a trip out West in '66 and visited Philip Cohen (H&S 254) in Phoenix - just came back on 1-1-68 from out East where I saw Joe Censabella (Hq 254) and just missed seeing Jimmie Steele (Co C 254) - am looking forward to visiting with the gang come Detroit....a sad, informative correction of our records from Stewart G. Cross (Co C 254) that his old buddy, S/Sgt Fred A. Jensen (listed as "missing" in Issue #4) was, in fact, a KIA at BULLINGEN the first morning of the Bulge.....grateful thanks to Reino Kiminki (Co A 254) out of Mass, Mich. for several hot addresses.....and lots of names from Jackson M. Jarvis (107 & 112) who was located via an inquiry to the Registrar, Univ. of W. Va. - Jack tells us he was assigned to Hq First Army after leaving the 112th and finally retired from the Reserve in 1962 with rank of Lt Col.....when Co D 107th was Federally inducted into active service in 1940 its CO, Philip D. Pearson, lived in Ishpeming and its Exec Off, Allan F. Olson, in Marquette - today Phil is back in Ishpeming for Inland Steel Co. as Manager, Ore Mines, and Allan lives in Marquette doing duty as General Mgr., Cliffs Dow Chemical Co. Both, of course, are faithful supporters of the Association. Many will recall that Co D's third officer at time of induction, William A. Richards, was killed on Omaha Beach as a major assigned to the 112th Bn.Wisconsin's 32nd Red Arrow division of the NG which served in 9 campaigns in two world wars, went out of existence on 12-30-67. It was 51 years old. In its place is a new 32nd infantry brigade of 4,000 men and half the size of the old Red Arrow division. Formed in Waco, Tex. 7-18-17 from Mich. and Wis. NG units it fought 4 French campaigns in WWI and 5 in WWII from NEW GUINEA to the PHILIPPINES. The division was last called to active duty during the Berlin crises on 10-15-61. A sad farewell to a great outfit.. it is most heartening and inspiring to receive responses from the many new locatees expressing their surprise and delight to be contacted after these many years.....copies of all previous

issues of the BS are available to anyone located after distribution of same - just let Hq know... another new one, thanks to Alex Macinsky (Co B 254) of Greene, N.Y. is Leland Moses (Co B 254) now located in Binghamton, N.Y. - thanks for nice letter, Lee, and your kind comments about the BS.....still another new addition to the address file is Francis E. Loose (H&S 254) who has already arranged to stay with friends in Detroit for that bivouac.....and while on H&S 254 Howard J. Linnert is planning to take time from his job with the Florida State Road Dept. to make Detroit.....rumor has it that a NG delegation is chartering a bus for the Detroit movement - to give them more "refreshment" time they claim.... thanks to Albert Corcoran (Co A 254) for a Xmas card out of the V.A. Hospital in Madison, Wis. where he is recuperating from a stroke taken in Jan. '65.....another ol' faithful, Andrew E. Little (Co A WWI) writes: "Enclosed find 2 bucks for '68 dues and 3 more to keep the BULL SHEET coming - Andy made the '63 and '64 reunions out of Rosebush, Mich.....another service retiree is Charles A. Hanover (107 & 1121) as a major AUS in Sept 1966.....our appreciation to Andy Simonis (522) for names and addresses of the 522nd gang with the modest notation: "None of us amounted to much but we did wear dog tags"...and to Bill Kessler (522) for addresses on Harvey Eisold and August Brummond (both 522) who happen to be brothers-in-law.....few Guardsmen can claim a perfect attendance record for regular & special training drills - M/Sgt Robert J. Jacka (Hq 107 NG) is one of the few - Bob enlisted in the Guard 9-16-47 and retired after 20 years of service.....Henry R. Snapp (Co B 254) of Greeneville, Tenn. and the Snapp Printing Co. inquires: "Why don't you publicize 254 reunions in the VFW and Legion Magazines - I have seen the 107th notices and they did not mean a thing to me since I joined the 254 at NEWQUAY, CORNWALL, in 1943 as did a great many others." We're with you on that, Hank, and, in fact, have repeatedly asked for individual notices for 107, 254 & 522 reunions but to no avail. Space is tight in these publications and their service is free so it seems we are stuck with the single 107th announcements.....Lt Col Elmer B. old outfits and to know that the boys are getting together again. Rans Blondo (Co F 107-112 Bn) and I have stayed in close touch all of these years mainly by phone which reminds me I called Ran's office a few minutes ago and got no answer - I suppose I'll get some long yarn about how hard he was working inspecting a nearby pub." (Sounds like the same ol' Rans). Tom is a Vice president for Northwestern Bell at Omaha, Neb... Mass. sportsmen recently paid tribute to William A. Tompkins (Co D 107) by naming Bill the Wildlife Conservationist of the year for his efforts in fighting water pollution in Mass. as chief aquatic biologist of the State's Fish and Game Division.....and thanks to Gene Faber (254-1121) for lots of information including a hot tip which led us to Charles E. Howard (Co A 107-1121) in McKeesport, Pa.....also a notice from Mike Brendzej (107-522) announcing the grand opening of Mike's Auto Sales in Sheboygan, Wis. last May - says he will take "good care" of his old comrades (no charge for the plug, Mike!).... "Good Conduct Medals" to Clayton "Nick" Eschen (H&S 254) for working over a bunch of Cleveland area addresses and Clarence A. Zastrow (Co B 254) a batch covering the Milwaukee area.....and how about this for a "play" - Maples to Duckworth to Saam. Bill Maples (H&S 107), a charter Association member back to '61 gave us Columbus, Ohio as Winston Duckworth's (Co E 107) present station who in turn directed us to Indio, Cal. to locate Dr. Frederick J. Saam DDS (Co E 107)..Wilbert A. Bennetts (Co C WWI) addressed a note to: "Comrades: Don't fall off the Christmas Tree - but receipt of BULL SHEET #3 prompts me to ask for Issues 1 and 2, if you still have copies. I guess at long last nostalgia has gotten the better of inertia and awakened an interest which has been asleep for a long, long time. My check for \$6.00 covering 3 years' dues is enclosed." Wilbert retired as Manager of the MUSKEGON (Mich) CHRONICLE on 3-1-63....announcement was made in Feb. of Brig. Gen. Leonard C. Ward's appointment to the post of acting assistant chief of the NG Bureau at the Pentagon. Adj. Gen. Clarence Schnipke (St. of Mich.) said Gen. Ward, assistant commander of the Mich. Guard's 46th Inf Div, would get the post for a 4 year term when the U.S. Senate confirms him as a brigadier general in the Army Reserve. The General's past military history and credentials for his new assignment are, of course, well known to our readers - so, simply, congratulations and best wishes, General!another perennial at reunions is Peter B. "Pete" Denofre (Co B 254) - just so Joe Yezzi (also Co B) won't get lonesome he claims.....and recognition is long overdue to Clyde C. "Babe" Asplund (Co A 254) for many up-to-date addresses - evidencing him as one of the best liked guys in the 254.

We are increasingly aware of the fact that a great many of the 254 gang have never read or seen the citation whereby the "Snortin' Bull" Bn was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation - as the 254th "Infantry" during the opening hours of the Bulge in the BULLINGEN-BUTENBACH area of the Belgique Ardenes. Our copy is right out of the Pentagon as received from Norman R. Cox (Co A 254) whose sister happened to be working for the War Dept. in Washington, D.C. back in 1945. To quote from Norm's letter: "She recognized it as my outfit and mailed a copy to me when I was still overseas. I kept it, hoping that some day every man of the 254th would get to read the citation. It made me feel good, and for that reason I know it will make the rest of my buddies feel the same way." (This as promised in Issue #4).

General Orders No. 32, War Department, Washington D.C., 23 April 1945

The 254th ENGINEER COMBAT BATTALION is cited for extraordinary heroism in action against an armed enemy on 17 December 1944 in Belgium. Early in the morning of 17 December 1944, the battalion was ordered to take up a defensive position on the corp's right flank. Although armed only with small arms, machine guns, and rocket launchers, and completely unsupported, the battalion successfully resisted several vicious attacks by armored infantry and tanks (editor's note: German 2nd SS Panzer Div). When finally overrun physically by enemy tanks, the battalion continued its determined and heroic resistance from successive positions for a period of 9 hours before relief finally arrived (editor's note: by elements of American 1st Inf Div that moved up from a rest area). This gallant and courageous action enabled successful measures to be taken to secure the safety of the corp's right flank, permitted the evacuation of large stores of gasoline and rations sorely needed by the enemy, and denied him the use of three vital routes of approach. The determination, heroism, and esprit de corps displayed by the individual officers and men of the battalion in this successful action against a powerful enemy armored force, despite severe losses, prevented the enemy from penetrating the corp's rear areas and contributed materially to the ultimate failure of his counterattack. It reflects great credit on the 254th ENGINEER COMBAT BATTALION and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service.

Reorganization of the 107th Engr Bn was recently completed whereby nearly all NG units in the Upper Peninsula were absorbed into the 107th. The Bn's strength was increased from about 450 to 740 men with the addition of artillery units (3rd Bn 182nd) as part of a revamping program for the nation's entire NG structure. The reorganization, however, left the 1437th Engineer Float Bridge Co stationed at Soo, Mich. and previously attached to the 107th for administrative and training purposes, out of the 107th's new makeup - it will now be directly under the State headquarters in Lansing. With the 46th Inf Div no longer in existence through the reorganization, the 107th will be a separate Army unit. While it will have basically much the same mission and training as in the past, it now can be used anywhere under Army direction. Group Hq is located in Flint. The new enlarged Bn will perform it's two weeks of field training at Camp Grayling from June 15-29, training this year with the Ohio NG. The Bn has undergone several periods of riot training in order to be better prepared for possible future assignments. Units comprising the 107th Bn now are located in these Upper Peninsula of Michigan communities: Ishpeming-Marquette - both will be part of Bn Hq & Hq Co at Ishpeming with the medical, communications and equipment sections located at Marq.; Calumet-Baraga - Co A Hq will be in Calumet with the 1st and 2nd platoons in Baraga; Ironwood-Iron River - Co B Hq will be in Ironwood with the 1st & 2nd platoons in Iron River; Gladstone - Co C with two platoons of a bridge company, which formerly was a separate unit, being absorbed into the company; Kingsford-Manistique - Co D Hq at Kingsford with the 1st and 2nd platoons at Manistique. Lt Col Austin E. Lindberg will continue to command the revamped battalion.
