



COR Program of Instruction

- A. What is COR- Cor is Latin for "heart". The inspiration for this name is drawn from the expression "cor ad cor loquitur", "heart speaks to heart." This was the episcopal motto of St. John Henry Newman and a variation of St. Francis de Sales "cor cordi loquitur." This phrase holds multiple meanings. How <u>God speaks to man, how man speaks to man, and how man speaks to God</u> (St. Newman). St. Newman speaks of this particularly through the Eucharist, and Father McGivney would through the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As brothers in Christ and members of his holy Church, we understand the importance and necessity of <u>how the masculine heart speaks to each other within true Christian friendship</u>. True Christian friendship, that is committed to building each other up in imitation of Christ, is a crucial component of a vibrant Catholic and fraternal council life.
- B. <u>Formation, prayer, and fraternity</u> are the three key elements of every Cor meeting. These elements and supporting structure are meant to enable men to come together in brotherhood, invest in their personal faith and formation, to sharpen each other as iron sharpens iron, to pray together, and to build a fraternity of Christ centered friendships and experiences. This meeting is intended to <u>support and enhance council life and vibrancy</u> within existing programs, events and the council business meeting. Additionally, to train and prepare Knights for the mission of the Church, making disciples.
