### **DISCERNING THE SPIRIT**

On Pentecost, we remember the day when the Holy Spirit came and was poured out on the disciples and first Christians in a spectacular way. As we conclude our celebration of the Easter season and begin our journey through Pentecost, I invite you to ponder with me this crucial question about the Third Person of the Trinity: How do we discern the Spirit? Let me share these theological thoughts:

First, the Spirit creatively acts in, with, for, and over us. As the Lord and Giver of life, the Pentecost Spirit moves all things. From the creation story where the Spirit breaths through the watery chaos to the Spirit's offering the water of life as a gift to the thirsty in the apocalyptic book, the Spirit of Christ relentlessly seeks bodies to give, heal, restore, and recreate life. Because of her embodied fluidity in relationship within creation, the Spirit cannot be boxed or restrained. Like the wind that blows anywhere it wishes, the Spirit breathes new life, energizes new visions, and unleashes new power. The *Parakletos* (Comforter) animates life to our bodies and brings fresh perspectives in our way of being, doing, dwelling, and relating as individuals, church, and community.

Secondly, the Spirit is at the center of prophetic endeavors. Biblical prophecy is a divine call to spiritual, moral, social, economic, ecological, and political transformations within persons, communities, and nations. Our prophetic responsibility as a church is to freely let the Spirit inspire and challenge us to engage in growing and deepening works of justice, peace, kindness, mercy, and love in the world and beyond. When we break open ourselves to the Spirit's

prophetic power, there is a life-giving change from a fearful atmosphere of indifference, hostility, and violence into a joyful celebration of inclusivity, hospitality, and *shalom*.

Thirdly, the Spirit reveals itself in mystery, diversity, inclusivity, and paradoxes. Sometimes, the Spirit hovers over us with gentleness persuading us to empty ourselves so that others may be full. At other times, we see its enormous power descending on the oppressed as they resist and are released from unjust systems. In the play and dance of life, the Spirit can manifest herself freely and creatively as a woman, man, child, bird, tree, ocean, fire, and anything we can imagine to bring about healing, renewal, and salvation on earth. As we faithfully live according to the "dying and resurrecting" example of Christ, we experience the Spirit as the power of life for all.
