

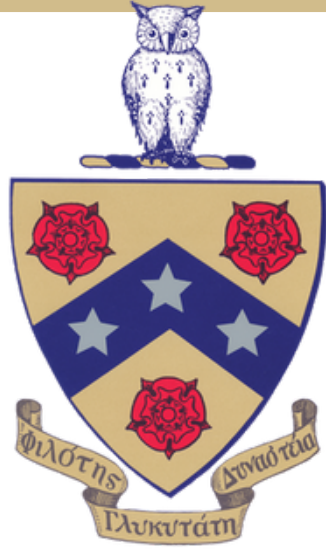

In the spring semester the Pi chapter gave 358 hours of their time to community service with about 13.27 hours per brother on average.

Some of the events that we did was the annual Pie a Pi day on 3/14, we also did participated in the college's Service Saturday, and we hosted 2 Blood Drives. The money we raised went to the Crawford County Center for Family Services.

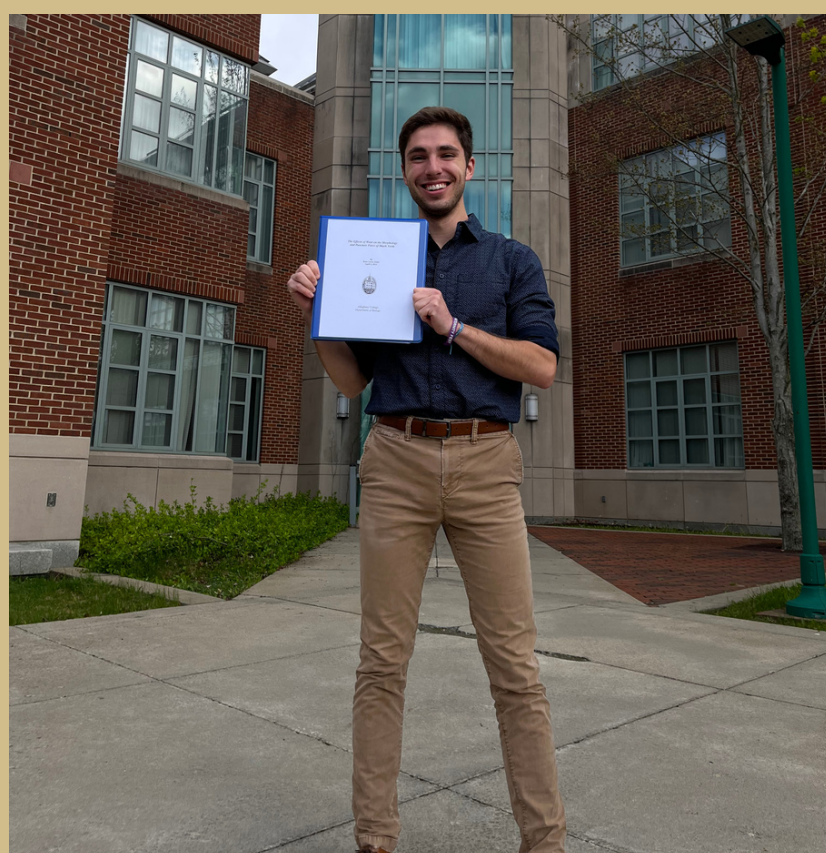

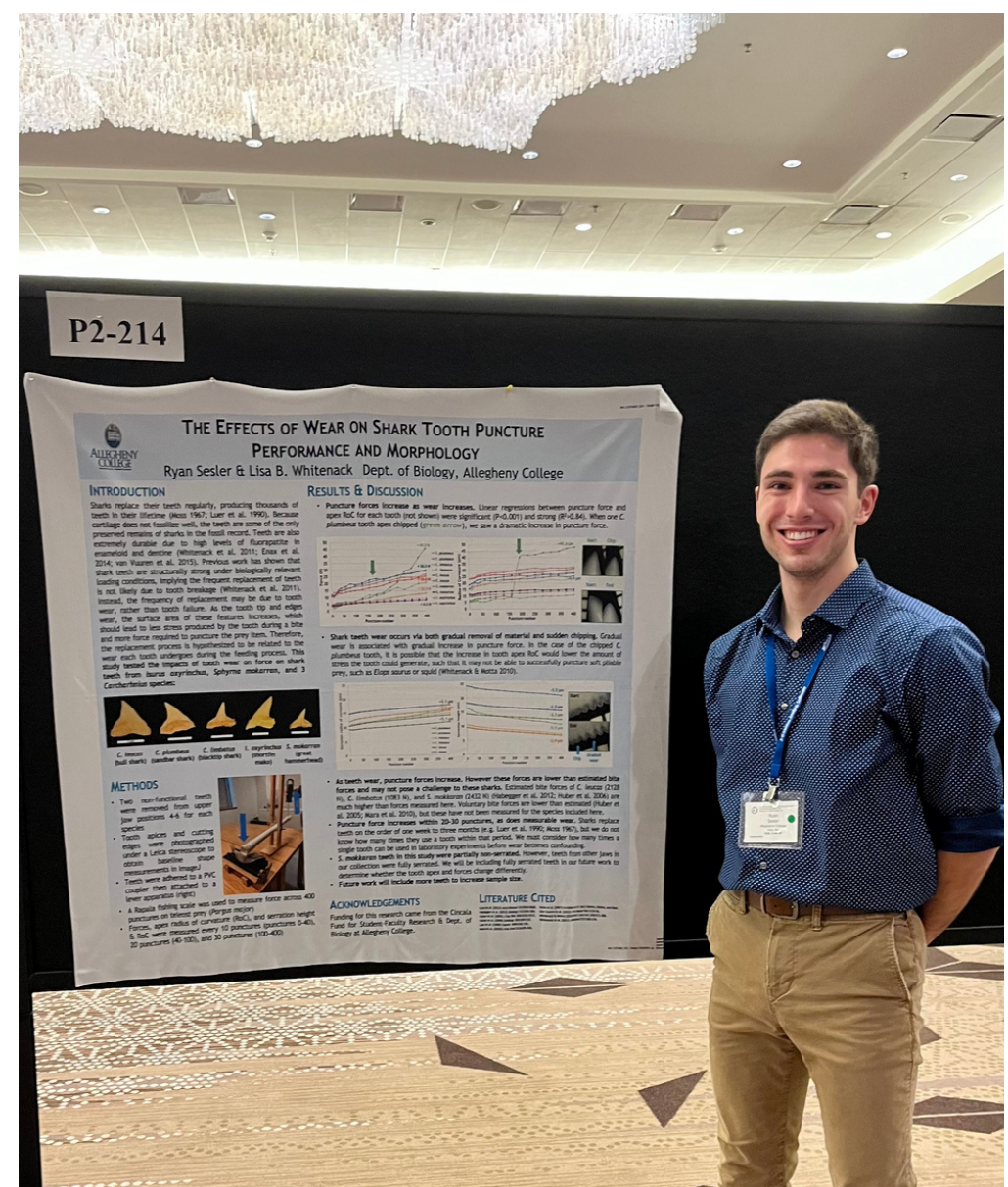


Caleb Moon

Brother of the Year



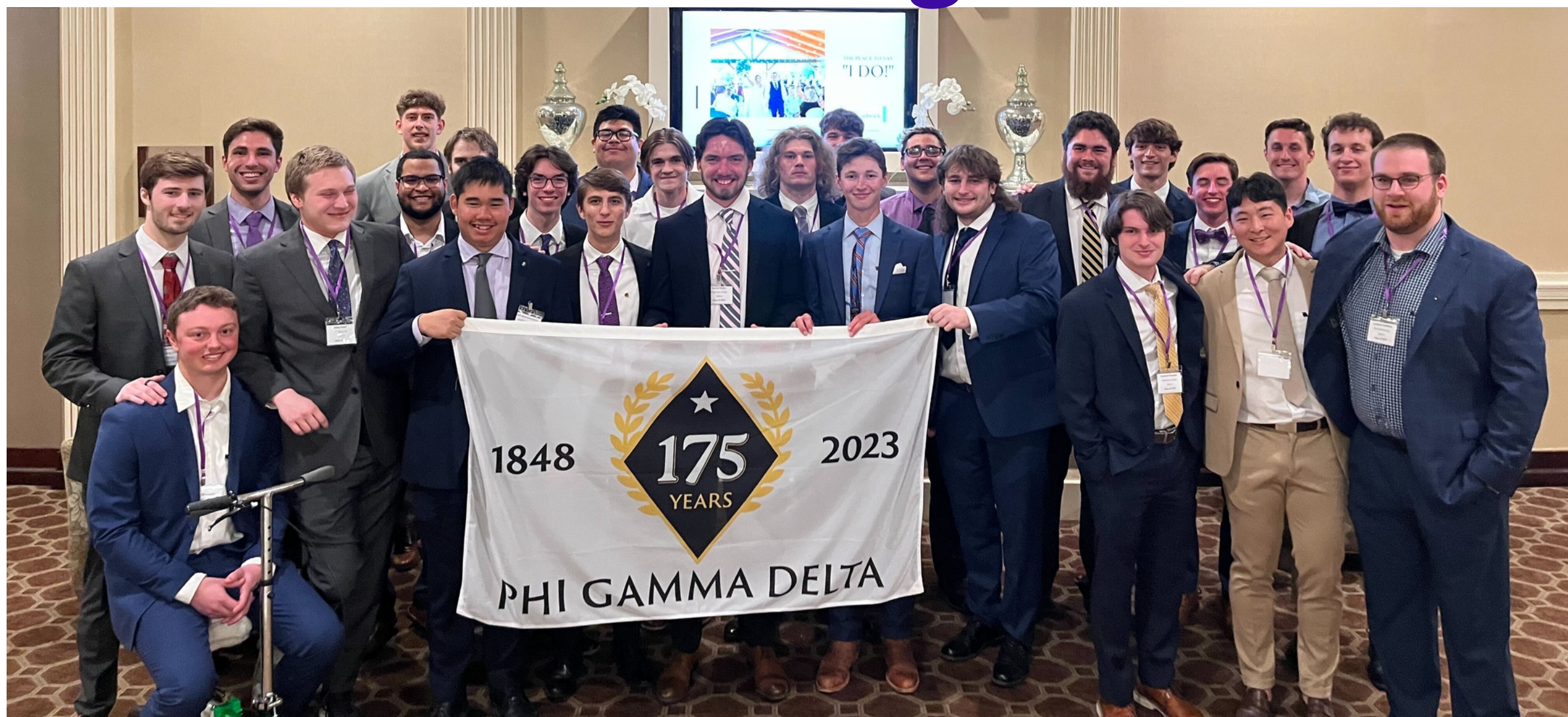
